ATTEMPT TO RUIN SHIP.

With the intention of ruining the hull of the battleship Connecticut, which will be launched at the New York navy yard tomorrow, some person or persons placed an obstruction on the ways. When it was placed there or by whom is not known, for it was not discovered until divers were sent down to make an investigation. This investigation was made as a matter of precaution, and the naval officers then learned that an obstruction had been placed on the ways that would have destroyed the work of months.

Officers at the navy yard will not discuss the matter at all and it would not have become known if, in addition to the special guard of marines, two watchmen had not been stationed at the stern of the vessel with loaded revolvers and instructions to fire at any suspicious object in the water. It is believed that the obstruction was brought to the yard and placed in position from a boat.

As is usual before a large ship is launched divers were sent down to see that the ways were clear. They went down for the first time on Saturday, and since the obstruction was found they have been making the most careful examination, and were working there Monday afternoon. They will be sent down for the last time today before the ship is launched, and Naval Constructor Baxter, who had charge of the launching, will be satisfied that everything is all right before he gives the signal which will send the great battleship into the water.

A special guard of marines was placed around the Connecticut last week, for it was feared then that some crank or insane person would enter the yard and try to do some damage. It was not thought at that time that an attack would be made from the water, and no special precaution was taken to prevent anyone from entering the yard that way.

While the naval officers would not discuss the nature of the obstruction found on the ways, it is known that it was not an explosive, and it is also known that if it had not been found and removed it would have either torn a great hole in the bottom of the ship or would have thrown it over on its side. None of the naval officers or men who have worked around the large shipyards can recall another case where a malicious attempt was made to wreck a battleship.

Ten Thousand Dollar Bed Too Short.

E. R. Thomas, banker and owner of one of the finest strings of racehorses in the world, is too long for the \$10,000 bed in the royal suite at the St. Regis, in New York. This gem of the cabinet-makers' art was built to accommodate six feet snugly. Mr. Thomas is more than six feet, and it was almost a case of allowing his feet to hang over the rosewood footboard. For the past few days, since Mr. Thomas and his wife became guests of the St. Regis, occupying the State suite, for which they pay \$125 a day, exclusive of the cost of the apartments for the valet and maid, friends of the young millionaire have been asking how he enjoyed the royal bed. They bantered him about this until finally, in an unhappy moment, he admitted that the princely couch was too short. Since then his friends have not ceased to twit him about the brevity of the \$10,000 bed and his extravagant length of limb. Fortunately for Mr. Thomas, there is another bed in this royal suite which was built with an eye for a long stretch. Of course, Mr. Thomas could curl up comfortably in the rosewood masterpiece, but this would be unsatisfactory. Therefore, the young banker occupies the bed in the adjoining room, while Mrs. Thomas finds the state bed as cozy as the most luxurious could desire. Mr. and Mrs. Thomas are the second guests of the St. Regis to engage the \$125 a day suite. They have been there several days, and intend to stay for an indefinite period. The suite consists of two bedrooms, a dining-room, library, parlor and bathroom. It cost Mr. Hahn \$100,000 to furnish this luxurious suite, and there is not an article of furniture in it that is not the masterpiece of some famous European cabinet-maker.

Attempts at Mediation.

Much interest is felt in Rome in the report that Premier Giolitti is to meet Count Von Buelow, the German chancellor, at Hamburg. One of the many reasons that might prompt such a meeting is possible discussion of mediation in the interest of peace in the far East. According to the Giornale d'Italia, of Rome the Italian government, in conjunction with Great Britain, would be willing to approach Russia with a proposition looking toward peace, but wishes to have assurance that in pursuing such a course she would have the support of her associates in the Triple Alliance. The support of France, according to the paper mentioned, was asked in the course of a recent interview between Signor Luzzatti, the Italian minister of the treasury, and M. Bouvier, the French minister of finance, at Nice.

The London Daily Mail's correspondent at Geneva states that Premier Giolitti's projected visit to Chancellor Von

Buelow is connected with the cause of peace in the far East, and that he intends visiting all the European courts.
