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

MURDER CONSPIRACY.

An amazing and sensational story of love, intrigue and assassination, in which the central figure is the beautiful Countess Theodolinda Bonmartini, is to be unraveled in the criminal courts in Rome in the course of the next few days.

The Countess Linda, as she is known in Italian society, is to be put on trial for conspiring with her brother, Signor Tulio Murri (who is an advocate), Professor Secchi (who is declared to be the lover of the Countess), Dr. Pio Naldi and a girl named Rosina Benetti (the mistress of Murri) to bring about the death of her husband.

The story of the tragedy, as outlined by the prosecution, carries one back to the Italy of medieval romance. Count Bonmartini, though a high noble of Bologna, was a man with an unsavory reputation, and he rented a flat in the Via Mazzini, in Bologna, in which, it is alleged, many infamous scenes took place.

The Count also had a palace in Venice, where the Countess Linda appears to have spent most of her time. There she met Professor Secchi, and under the influence of her husband's neglect, and his numerous intrigues, fell in love with him.

At the beginning of September, 1902, the neighbors of Count Bonmartini in the Via Mazzini made complaint to the police that an intolerable odor was coming from the Count's flat, to which he was known to have returned five or six days earlier. The police made an examination, and then burst open the door. In a pool of blood in the middle of the luxuriously furnished room lay the decomposing body of the Count. He had been stabbed in the throat.

Some feminine belongings were found scattered about the apartment, and the dead man's pockets, cash box and bureau had been rifled. The police formed the theory that it was the tragic end of the Count's numerous intrigues. A closer search resulted in the discovery of some letters which put a different complexion on the crime, and caused the police to interrogate Signor Murri, the father of the Countess.

On September 10 Senator Murri's son, Tulio Murri, was arrested at Ala, on the Austro-Italian frontier. He declared himself guilty of the count's death.

Murri had visited the count in the Via Mazzini, he said, to remonstrate with him for his brutal treatment of his sister the countess. A bitter quarrel followed, and the count seized a knife and made a murderous attack on him. In the scuffle the knife penetrated the count's throat.

But one of the letters which the police had found implicated a girl named Anna Sant'angelo, and in due course this girl was arrested. She confessed that her real name was Bonetti, and that she had been living with Murri. She declared that the count had been murdered by Murri and a young physician named Naldi.

Dr. Naldi then fell into the clutches of the police. He was found to be in low water, and to have a rather doubtful reputation. The police found him very pliable, and in a few days drew from him the whole sordid story. Professor Secchi, he said, was in love with the countess, and she had plotted with him to poison the count by means of an injection of curare, which he gave to Naldi, together with a hyodermic syringe. The scheme was abandoned, however, and another plot was hatched. The countess, who was then in Venice, obtained a wax impression of the key to the count's flat in Bologna, sent them a duplicate key by the girl Bonetti, and on the evening of August 27, 1902, Naldi and Murri let themselves into his apartment and hid behind the curtains. When the count entered the flat Murri dragged him down, and Dr. Naldi, whose surgical knowledge enabled him to do the deed without bungling, drove a knife into the count's throat, killing him instantly.

Then they disordered the room to give color to the story that was concocted, strewed some of the girl Bonetti's linen about the apartment, locked the door and fled. The arrest of the countess followed and Secchi was taken soon after. A search of their houses resulted in the unearthing of a mass of correspondence which, the police declare, leaves no proof wanting as to the share which each took in this revolting and sensational tragedy.

High Up in a Chestnut Tree.
An automobiling party passing along the road near Stettlesville, Pa., Wednesday night heard hoarse yells for help apparently from some point up in the air.

After considerable yelling the party learned that the victim was up a nearby chestnut tree, at the foot of which was a building of forbidding countenance and nervous temperament and that the man very much wanted to come down.

The autists unscrewed the brilliant acetylene gas lamp from the front of their machine and while one carried the lamp to dazzle the dog the others, armed with clubs, prepared to "smash him."

But the dog saw them first. The man with the lamp failed to make connections between the rays of light and canine eyes and the result was that a member of the party lost a goodly portion of his clothes just where most needed. Returning valiant-

ly to the attack the party finally vanquished the dog. Then a greasy looking tramp slowly slid down the tree trunk with a polite "thank'e, misters." He explained sorrowfully that he had been treed since early in the afternoon, whereat the man with the torn clothing unfeelingly remarked he wished the hobo was still up there.

Killed by Her Scho-mates.
Marguerite Lenoir, a child of 12, has died as the result of a savage attack made upon her at a Boulogne, France, boarding-school. For some various articles belonging to the boarders had been missed, but the culprit remained undiscovered. Finally, acting on the advice of Jeanne Bonet, one of the pupils, it was agreed that each boarder should hand over some article to her aunt, who, by occult means, would discover the culprit. Next day Jeanne returned with a gold watch and chain, the property of Marguerite Lenoir, who she declared to be the thief. Immediately a mob of little girls attacked the unsuspecting Marguerite and beat her so severely that she died the same evening.
