Judge Bradford, in the United States Court, in Wilmington, Del., today, discharged the receivers of the Diamond State Steel Company, and will dismiss the petition to put the company declared a bankrupt.

Leicester, Mass., is greatly excited over the murder of Mrs. Emma Brigham, 56 years old, whose body was found this morning in a woodlot near the home of her mother, Mrs. Jane M. Richards, with whom she lived in Leicester Center. The body was found covered with boughs and bloodstains were found all over the snow in the vicinity. There is, so far, no clue to the perpetrator of the murder.
