THE OMNIBUS CLAIMS BILL.

Both Houses of Congress have passed the omnibus claims bill which carries appropriations of thousands of dollars for the payment of claims against the government, which have been pending for upwards of thirty years. The beneficiaries are many in number and are well scattered throughout the State. The majority of the claims are for property taken by the government after the close of the war, but in some cases citizens of the State loyal to the United States government during the war are paid.
