Immigration Records Broken.

If the present unusual flow of immigrants to the United States continues until July 1, all immigration records will be broken and the total number of immigrants admitted into the country will amount to more than 1,000,000 persons during the 12 months which will end June 30 next. The record up to the present time is that of the fiscal year 1903 during which 857,046 immigrants arrived in the United States. The total number of immigrants arriving in the United States during the seven months ending February 28 was 521,445. In February alone 67,117 immigrants were admitted, and the number which arrived during March was much greater.

The bulk of the immigrants come from Russia, Italy and Austria-Hungary. Immigration from Russia has been on the increase since 1902, but it took an upward bound in 1903. Local troubles started an exodus from that country several years ago, out the outbreak of the war with Japan produced a stampede, which is continuing. During the month of February, 1905, the number of immigrants from Russia was 11,998, or an increase of 80 per cent. over 1903. Since January 1, 1903, 433,165 have been admitted to the United States.

Henry W. Diedrich, American Consul at Bremen, Germany, says that more than 100,000 immigrants pass that city on their way to the United States every year, and the larger number of rejected cases indicate that the character of a number of the immigrants passing through Bremen last year fell below the usual standard. Thousands of other Russians of the lowest type were rushed over to England through the ports of Libau, Hamburg, Bremen and Rotterdam. Then everything was done to rid the city of London of these Russians by assisting them to America.

"These immigrants," Consul Diedrich says, "impress one as being more or less physically and mentally degenerate, unable and unwilling to do any but the cheapest kind of work and by overstocking the labor market they tend to reduce the standard of living of the American wage-worker and to increase the army of unemployed and discontented, and there seems but little probability that such as these will be lifted by our institutions and civilization."

Great as the Russian emigration has been in recent months, that of Austria-Hungary has far surpassed it, being 100,000 greater, or 539,417.

Peter Jackson Vanquished.

Philadelphia Jack O'Brien was awarded the decision last night by Referee Charley White over Young Peter Jackson, of Baltimore. After ten rounds of fighting before the Eureka Athletic Club, of the Monumental City, O'Brien proved himself too clever for the negro and had the advantage of every round except the fifth and sixth, when Jackson managed to land on Jack's face and struck and hurt the Philadelphian.

The agreement to fight clean breaks greatly handicapped Jackson, as Peter does his most effective work on night-fighting. Jackson tried his best to bore in, and vainly attempted to land a knock-out punch, but O'Brien was far too wily and simply danced in and out, jabbing away at Jackson, and had the colored boy guessing by his clever foot-work.

At the first tap of the bell, Jackson tried to force matters, but O'Brien stabbed his left to the face repeatedly, which soon stopped Peter's running. Jackson kept trying for the head with his right, but Jack kept out of harm's reach.

In the second and third rounds O'Brien played for Jackson's stomach and had but little difficulty in landing but his blows lacked the necessary force. Jackson was in prime form.

In the fifth Jackson caught Jack right and left to face and right to the stomach in quick succession that brought O'Brien to a clinch and had him hugging. At the end of the round Jack was plainly in distress. He rounded around, though, in good form, and came back strong in the sixth and kept jabbing Jackson in the face, and had his face a good mouth bleeding. Jackson was unable to land effectively, although he did considerable aggressive work.

From this time on until the finish O'Brien outgaited his dusky adversary at every stage of the game, and the decision awarding him the contest was favorably received by the 3,000 spectators.
