## DISORDERS IN RUSSIA.

Moscow newspapers state that a mob at Nizni Novgorod murdered nearly a hundred citizens on Sunday, including women and children. Many persons were mutilated.

The disorders at Nizni Novgorod have now continued four days, with daily collisions between the rival camps into which the workmen and the rioting roughs have divided, but there has been no general riot since Sunday's five-hour fray.

According to the government advices twelve men were killed and three were fatally wounded Monday and Tuesday night. On Sunday night a bomb was thrown against the school house in the suburb of Sornovo, where a detachment of soldiers was quartered. The thrower of the bomb was killed.

A regular blood feud appears to exist between the socialistic workmen in the Sornovo district and the stevedores, brickmakers, and cab drivers. The factions invade each other's territory and fight on sight, using revolvers and clubs.

The governor of Olessa has issued an extraordinary proclamation, which, when posted in the city today, had the effect of increasing the already bitter feeling against the Jews among the troops and more ignorant classes of the population.

The governor says he has received a number of anonymous letters denouncing persons as socialists and revolutionaries, which he entirely ignores, believing, in most cases, these communications were inspired by motives of personal vengeance.

"Letters have also come from the Jews charging the police with preparing for a Jewish massacre."

The governor then declares that such action is impossible and will not be permitted, but he adds:

"The governor is astonished at the Jews addressing such letters to him, seeing that it is the Jews themselves who caused all the disorders. The police invariably found revolvers, bombs and prohibited literature in Jewish houses. But for the Jews there would have been no disturbances, no Kniaz Potemkin affair. Now the Jews have the impertinence to bring charges against the police."

Former Ambassador to Russia and Germany Andrew D. White in a lecture in Ithaca, N. Y., Tuesday night to the summer school students of Cornell on the subject of "Evolution Versus Revolution in Politics," said:

"Russia can now only be righted by revolution, as her evolutionary processes are now too far disarranged to be capable of pulling her through her present crisis. The dams against modern thought held up by the aristocracy will be thrown down suddenly in the near future by the evolutionary reactionaries and anarchy will break loose, all of which will lead to better things in the end."

## CHILDREN FOUND.

With only wild berries for food during the seventy-two hours in which they wandered aimlessly in the thickets of Anne Arundel county, Md., Lena and Sophia Cohen, daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Cohen, who disappeared Sunday morning while on an outing with their father at Altona, on Stony Creek, were found by Walter Johnson, a twelve-year-old farmer boy, at 9 o'clock yesterday morning, sitting in a clump of bushes on the banks of the creek. The children were perfectly well, and, after being provided with food and otherwise cared for by women at Altona, were brought to the city and restored to their parents at 1 o'clock yesterday.

When the Cohen house was reached more than a thousand persons surged to get a glimpse of the little wanderers. Women grabbed their hands and arms and kissed them as the men struggled on with their precious burdens. The scene at the home was pathetic in the extreme. The house was crowded with friends of the distracted parents, and when Cohen and his friends—a way having been forced by the detail of policemen—entered the little store the mother was wild with joy, and grabbed the elder girl in her arms.

The children's bodies, faces, and legs were covered with welts, the result of the terrific attacks of swarms of mosquitoes, which they nearly devoured them at night as they slept in the woods. Great scratches streaked their legs and arms, received while gathering wild raspberries, blackberries, and other fruits, the only food that they had during the three days of their wandering.

Lena, the elder girl, said that she and her sister simply wandered off from the Altona shore and lost their way.

Johnson, the boy who found the little girls, was one of the great army of men, women, and children who, since Sunday, had been scouring the thicket
