Anarchists in New England.

There has been a general round-up during the past two weeks of Italians suspected of being active in spreading the teaching of anarchy among their countrymen in Boston, but yesterday it was declared by the police that no member of the "reds" organization remains in the city.

This activity on the part of the police began when information reached headquarters that anarchists from all over the world were going to Boston to hold their annual assembly. Last Thursday night two Italians were ejected from a north end church for distributing anarchistic literature among the congregation.

The city of Lynn seems to be the center of the anarchists in New England. Not long ago a mission priest gave up holding meetings there because he said his gatherings were being broken up by anarchists. The Lynn members of the organization put out a circular last week addressed to their "fellow-workers" and signed "The Anarchists of Lynn." It was printed in English and was evidently intended for circulation in all the New England cities and towns of importance. The circular calls for the abolition of classes, the distribution of all property and wealth in equal shares, and declares against all authority, churches, politics and parliamentarism, closing with these sentences:

"Yes, we, as anarchists, want to destroy all the actual institutions from their foundations because we see they are wrong. And to that work we consecrate the best part of our energy. Of course, in the fight some individuals are lost, but we can't help it. Though cruel, the experience shows that the tree of liberty grows in the soil wet of blood. And we would gladly see the number of these victims certificate and our lives lost with them if we could stop forever the daily massacre of our fellow-workers. For this redemption of humanity from moral and material slavery we march, and nothing will stop us."

Suicide from Despondency.

Despondent because of a chronic stomach trouble, unable to work and having spent his last dollar to provide food for his family, John Geischsky, according to the police, deliberately ended his life by laying his head across the track in front of a fast express train at Philadelphia yesterday. Geischsky had a wife and three small children. By strict economy and hard work he had managed to save more than \$500 with the intention of opening a baker shop in a good section of the city. Three years ago he was seized with a peculiar stomach trouble which put an end to his brilliant hopes. Geischsky went to all the hospitals in the city to secure help, but they all pronounced his case as almost hopeless. He received treatment at various institutions, however, and when they failed, went to several specialists of stomach troubles. His little horde was rapidly diminishing by doctor's fees and for the last three weeks he and his family were facing eviction for non-payment of rent. Geischsky went to a baker's shop and endeavored to work. He could not stand the strain, however, and after three hours returned to his home more despondent than ever. According to his wife, Geischsky's despondency was increased by the actions of a doctor with whom he had been treating. According to the story told by his wife, Geischsky went to see this doctor Saturday morning, explaining that at last his money was all gone. The doctor became indignant and put Geischsky from his office, telling him not to come back unless he could pay for his treatment. Geischsky kissed his wife and children Saturday afternoon, and told them that he might not get back for sometime, as he was going to see some friends up town. The unfortunate man was walking along the Reading Railway tracks, at 2:13, when a fast express train bore down upon him. According to the police, Geischsky waited until the train was within half a square of him and deliberately lay down and placed his head upon the track. Several train men, who saw the deed, called to him and started in his direction. The unfortunate man waved them away, and shouted that he wanted to die. Before anyone could prevent, the train had severed his head from his body.

Japanese Monroe Doctrine.

In a special dispatch to the Chicago Record-Herald, from Portsmouth, N. H., Walter Wellman says: "There is to be a Japanese empire on the mainland of Asia. It is to embrace Korea and Manchuria and probably a part of Siberia. The Japan of the present is a mere island kingdom. The Japan of the future is to rule the littoral of the northern Asiatic continent, reaching far into the interior, comprising vast, fertile and populous provinces. The new Japan is to be three as great in area and twice as great in population as the Japan of the present. Thesea of Japan is to be the center, the heart of this new empire. That sea is to become a Japanese lake. Japan is to dominate it and all the lands lying about it. This dominion of the Japan sea and its coast country on all sides the Japanese hold is absolutely essential to their national safety. The pretension the Japanese put forth as to the sea of Japan is not unlike the Monroe doctrine of the United States applied to the Caribbean sea. Japan has a Monroe doctrine of her own; and the meaning of it is that Japan will view as an unfriendly act any effort on the part of European powers to establish sovereignty or to plant its systems on or near the shores of the sea of Japan. This Japanese Monroe doctrine applies not only to Russia but to all European powers. The information upon which this dispatch is based comes from a high and unimpeachable source—from authority which would create surprise were I at liberty to identify it. I have the highest authority for the statement that if the Russians find themselves unable to agree to a treaty which achieves this end there will be no peace."
