Burned in Public Square.

The people of Sulphur Springs, Tex., gathered on the courthouse square yesterday morning and publicly burned Tom Williams, an eighteen-year-old and criminally assaulted a fourteen-year-old white girl named Mary Childs.

There was only a slight attempt on the part of the town officials to prevent the lynching. Throughout Thursday night, officers and enraged citizens searched for the negro, and he was caught by officers at dawn yesterday morning, hiding in a barn two miles from the scene of his crime.

The officers were soon surrounded by the mob and forced to give him up. The negro was tied on a horse and taken to Sulphur Springs. The news of the capture spread rapidly, and every inhabitant of the town rushed for the public square, where all seemed to know vengeance would be wreaked. When the trembling negro was unbound from the horse, he was so weak from fright he could not stand unsupported.

"Burn him," was a cry that started and echoed by hundreds of voices. There were a few who favored hanging, but no attention was paid to them.

In the meantime the victim of the negro was brought to the place, and his victim at once positively identified him. So forceful were his assertions that he then confessed, but begged loudly for mercy. This he kept up continually until the fire licked up around him, and his pleas gave way to frantic screams.

Dry goods boxes were broken up for fuel and a heap, a yard high in the form of a circle, was piled about him. Oil was poured upon the pile. It was ten minutes from the start of the blaze before the negro began to burn. Piercing screams after screams ensued for five minutes, and his features were convulsed in agony. His death was so horrible that many ran, terror-stricken, from the scene.

The body was only partially burned and was taken down two hours after the tragedy.

The negro adroitly waylaid his victim in the outskirts of the town, and choked her into unconsciousness. She was a well-known schoolgirl in short skirts, and a favorite in the town. There seems to be general satisfaction at Sulphur Springs over the lynching, and threats are being made against worthless negroes of the place. This has caused a hurried exodus of many of the black citizens.

Remains Laid to Rest.

Archbishop Chapelle was buried yesterday morning under the central altar of the St. Louis Cathedral in New Orleans. The change in the programme made at the last moment at the suggestion of the health authorities, who feared that the assembling of many thousands of persons at the cathedral in the heart of the infected section, as would be the case in the event of a public funeral, would be dangerous. The funeral services were simple, but impressive. A mass was celebrated at 9 o'clock, in which 50 of the clergy took part. Mayor Behrman, Dr. Felix P. Gaudin, supreme president of the Catholic Knights of America; Rev. Fathers Weldon, Dalton and Spillard, the president of the Holy Cross College; Fathers Hanrahan, Lorent and Marin, president of the Jesuits' College; Father O'Shanahan and many prominent members of the Catholic clergy and laity were present to pay their last tribute to the dead. After the mass Father Biever, professor extraordinary to the archbishop, delivered a eulogy on the deceased archbishop. After the ceremony of absolution the body was carried by eight priests into the vault of the cathedral, which was then sealed. The question of the successor of Archbishop Chapelle will not be settled for some months, as it will be impossible to hold a convocation of bishops in New Orleans until after the epidemic is over.

Charged with Poisoning.

A dispatch from Grayling, Mich., says Mrs. Naomi Aldrich, of Frederick, a little town north of Detroit, was arrested Thursday night and is in the county jail there, charged with the murder of her two little sons, aged ten and twelve years. The theory of the police is that the little boys were murdered to obtain the \$50 life insurance that was carried on the lives of each. Mrs. Aldrich, who is twenty-eight years old, has been married twice. Her first husband, Bert Saule, was the father of the two children in connection with whose death she is under arrest. The children, it is alleged were insured for \$50 each in July. They were taken sick July 5, and one died July 8 and the second one died July 9. It is alleged that both showed symptoms of metallic poisoning during their illness. After the death of the children Coroner Dr. O'Neil performed a post-mortem examination and sent the stomachs of the children to Ann Arbor and Lansing for analysis. It is alleged that the chemist found arsenic in each stomach. George Aldrich, the woman's second husband, has not lived with her for a year and a half, and she has supported herself by washing and housework, with some assistance from the county authorities. It is alleged the woman showed no grief when the children died.
