Police officers who were summoned Sunday by Mrs. Theobald von Bovens, whose husband had locked himself in a room in Berlin and would not open the door, broke it down and found him dead. By his side was a memorandum which related that before his marriage he had worked at his calling as a wood carver in America, the localities not being given, and that at a ball one evening a young girl tried to kiss him; that he repelled her and she drew him a herself. The next day, October 1, 1885, a kinsman of the girl challenged Von Bovens to a so-called "American duel," drawing lots to determine which antagonist should kill himself. Von Bovens drew black and under the agreement he was to kill himself in 12 years. He returned to Germany, married, and the twelfth anniversary of the agreement passed unregarded and each succeeding one, until a short time ago, when an American named Fish arrived in Berlin with a letter from Von Bovens' antagonist reminding him of the duty, which he had not fulfilled. Von Bovens had taken cyanide potassium. He was enrolled on the police records of the district as a naturalized American. Mitchell Has A Candidate. President John Mitchell, of the United Mine Workers of America, will visit President Roosevelt at the White House today by appointment. The conference will relate in no way to conditions among the coal miners of Pennsylvania, but will be entirely in connection with the appointment of an internal-revenue collector for the Scranton district in Pennsylvania. Mr. Mitchell is very anxious to have Louis Hammerling appointed to the position. That would be easy, if the Pennsylvania delegation in Congress assents. But Mr. Mitchell has not experienced an easy time in obtaining the delegation's support for his candidate, although, at the present juncture in Pennsylvania, it is thought by some it will pay the Pennsylvanians to line up with Mr. Mitchell.
