### Thief Hid in Package.

A thief who entered the Security Storage Company's warehouse, in New York, in an express package Thursday, was caught yesterday as he was about to leave the warehouse hidden in the same package along with \$700 worth of stolen goods. On Thursday night he climbed out of his package, and after rifling the warehouse repacked himself and his plunder.

When caught yesterday he said his name was John Schmidt and told the story of his robbery. On Thursday afternoon at 4 o'clock two packing cases were taken to the company's warehouse at 211 Spring street. Schmidt was in one of them, and was fitted with spring locks so as to be opened from the inside. With him was a bottle of whisky, a set of burglar's tools and a dark lantern. The other box was used for packing his plunder.

Schmidt emerged Thursday night and ransacked the place and at 7 o'clock yesterday morning was safely repacked with the loot. An employee saw one of the boxes move unaccountably as it stood alone on the floor, and peeping through a knot hole in the top, observed the man's hat. He immediately smashed the packing case.

Five minutes later an expressman called for the two boxes which contained Schmidt and the stolen goods. The police went with the expressman to meet the man who sent him after the boxes. This man, who gave the name of Robert Arnold, was found waiting at the Bowery and Second avenue and was arrested.

### Bull Fight in Texas.

At the bull fight at Ciudad Juarez near El Paso, Texas on Thursday, given for the American mining convention, there was a panic when Felix Robert, the French matador, who claims to be the only matador of that nationality, was tossed in the air and carried from the arena bruised and bleeding.

Later the same bull, a ferocious beast from the ranch of Gen. Luis Teran, governor of Chihuahua, made a run and plunged its long sharp horns through Matador Francisco Alonzo Piquero, tossing him into the air first, then dragging him about the ring, blood streaming from the wounds in the man's body.

The spectators sickened at the sight, and the women fainted and screamed to be taken out. The arena was packed with Americans from every section of the United States, few of whom had ever seen a bull fight, and for a time the situation was serious. Many men rushed from the sickening sight in horror, while the women in many instances were carried out unconscious.

Order was finally restored, but most of the Americans left, deciding that they had already seen enough of the Mexican and Spanish national sport, although this was only the second bull up for slaughter out of the four marked for the matador's sword.

### Suspicious of Austria.

A dispatch from Viennasays: Speaking of the naval demonstration against Turkey which a combined fleet of the powers will make in the event of the Sultan's continued refusal to accept the ultimatum of the powers on Macedonian reform, a prominent diplomat said yesterday: "The giving to an Austrian admiral (Admiral Ritter von Jodanis) the command of the combined fleet is a dangerous honor, because Austria is being jealously watched by the powers, who will not permit her to reap any of the benefits, and nobody doubts that it is the ultimate intention of the powers to secure material advantages at the expense of Turkey. Germany would never for an instant permit Austrian aggrandizement, because Italy, in retaliation, would take steps leading to the breaking up of the triple alliance, and without the triple alliance Germany would be practically isolated in Europe. Germany and Italy are willing for Austria to bear the onus of the action against Turkey, but they are unanimous in the determination that she shall reap no reward, while Great Britain would gladly look upon any action tending to weaken the triple alliance. Turkey undoubtedly fully realizes the weakness of the proposed demonstration, owing to the jealousies of the powers, and, therefore, she is likely to prove odiate."

### No "Tinkle Tinkle."

For attempting to introduce in Portland, Ind., a popular fad, eight High School girls were suspended by the principal Thursday. When the young ladies climbed the stairs to the study room there was something that attracted the attention of the faculty and caused them to turn a sharp ear. "Tinkle, tinkle, tinkle" was the sound that came from the invisible somewhere. The principal never said "garter" once, but the eight pupils knew by what he said that he was "wise." They were lined up and movements were required of them that would prove their guilt or innocence. The noise that followed these movements gave him their number, and the eight were suspended.
