Long Distance Practice March.

The Sixth Field Battery of the United States Artillery, commanded by Capt. G. W. Gatchell, entered Fort Sam Houston, Texas, yesterday amid the cheers of the local garrison.

The battery broke the world's record for long-distance practice march of artillery, having covered the estimated 1,100 miles from Fort Riley, Kansas, to Fort Sam Houston in fifty-five days. The battery was compelled to make several detours in order to evade bad roads and an unusually rough country. This made the distance which it actually covered considerably longer than by rail.

It is asserted by army men at Fort Sam Houston that it is by far the longest practice march ever made by artillery in time of peace, and that no forced march in time of war, with the exception of Napoleon's retreat from Moscow, compares with it in distance. The artillerymen of the Sixth Battery were a sorry appearing set of men. Their clothing was in tatters and so covered with mud and dirt that the color of the clothing could not be distinguished. The men are haggard and lean. Many of them were scarcely able to travel. The horses resembled moving skeletons.

A blizzard swept down upon the battery last Monday morning just after it left Austin. It continued during nearly all of the remainder of the march to San Antonio, about ninety miles. The men walked nearly the whole distance in order to keep warm.

The battery lost one man, Private Arthur Hall, during the march. He died in the hospital at Austin from malaria, caused, according to the statement of physicians who attended him, by exposure and hardship encountered on the march.

A Dramatic Climax.

An appeal to ancient law came as a dramatic climax Thursday in the case of William W. Patterson, on trial in Henrico county, charged with attempted assault four years ago upon Miss Corn Crittendon. The defense had introduced witnesses who testified that the defendant and the prosecuting witness long had been sweethearts and that he often had slept at her house. An attempt also was made to show that the moral character of the girl was not above suspicion. When she took the stand the attorney for the defense, after subjecting her to a rigid cross-examination in which he endeavored to bring out the relations alleged to have been sustained between Patterson and the girl, declared that his client was willing to accept a sentence of eighteen years provided that the prosecuting witness prove by competent professional testimony that her life had been blameless.

Louis O. Wendenburg, counsel for the prosecution, sprang to his feet in protest. "Under no conditions will I submit my witness to this indignity," he cried. "Such a proposition is unheard of, even in criminal law. I appeal to the court to sustain me."

Judge Scott ruled the question out, and the case went to the jury, who found the prisoner guilty and, as heretofore stated, sentenced him to five years in the penitentiary.

Patterson refused to testify relative to his relations with the girl, although he said that he had bought wearing apparel for her, and that on one occasion she had hidden him in a closet while other people were in the house.

The Algeciras Conference.

The published interviews with German diplomats, in which they say that Germany is going to the conference at Algeciras with peaceful intentions, have greatly relieved the anxiety of the business and other sections of London. They have, however, made no impression on the diplomats and other officials of Great Britain, who, while they still believe that in the end the majority of the powers will uphold the French contentions, expect some stormy sessions of the conference, and anticipate the possibility of the withdrawal of Germany.

In official circles it is considered that the views of France and Germany with regard to the policing of Morocco cannot be reconciled. Germany, they believe, will certainly hold to her agreement to give France control of the frontier police but will insist on international control of the interior gendarmerie, which France maintains should be left to her. France will contend for this point almost as strongly as she will her claim to control the frontier garrisons.

Great Britain will support the contention of France for the control of the interior gendarmerie, as well as all other French contentions. It is believed in London that Spain and Italy will take the same stand, as it is not thought that any of the powers except Germany will desire to send troops to Morocco. The powers are prepared, it is understood, to depend on France for the protection of the interests of foreigners in Morocco.

No great difficulties are anticipated with regard to financial and other reforms as the views of Germany and France on these points are not widely divergent.

Bold Robbery.

A daring robbery took place yesterday in the National Banking Company's office in Newark, N. J., when a satchel containing several thousands of dollars disappeared from the counter, while the man who had just drawn the money turned for a minute to speak with a friend. Both he and his friend say they saw no one approach the spot where the satchel had been placed. The police have no clew.

Leban Dennis, secretary of the George Brown & Co. stone works, went into the bank about noon to draw \$3,150, the weekly pay roll. He deposited the money in a satchel, but as he started to leave he met a friend and placed the satchel on the check shelf, and then turned to his acquaintance. When he looked for the satchel a few moments later it was gone.

The bank is less than 100 yards from police headquarters and a general alarm was sent out. The empty bag was found yesterday afternoon by a boy in the hallway of the building at 204 Market street.

Carries Bullet in His Heart.

John L. Pruden, of Richmond, carrying a .32-caliber bullet within the pericardium of his heart, has recovered from the wound. Pruden, who is 18 years old, and George Williams were out shooting a cat. They had with them a revolver, which was thought to be empty, and Williams carelessly pointed it at Pruden while reloading. The weapon was discharged. When probing for the ball the throbbing of the heart is said to have almost knocked the instruments from the surgeon's hands. The physicians were afraid to probe further and decided to let nature take its course. Many of the physicians attending were under the impression at the time that the bullet rested within the pericardium, and several of them are positive that the wall of the heart was penetrated. Pruden suffers no inconvenience from the shot. He was in bed just one month from the effects of it.


