FINNISH CRIME.

Intense excitement prevails at Marlinton, W. Va., over the outrage perpetrated on Miss Ona Bird, 16 years old, daughter of a resident of Pocahontas county, who, while with a young man named Gladwell, with whom she had eloped, was taken from her husband and shamefully treated by two men said to be Albert Gay and Warwick Ratliff. The accused are now in jail at Marlinton, and threats of lynching are heard on all sides.

The prisoners have been fully identified. They are nervous and excited, and are terrified when crowds of men and boys pass the jail.

Miss Bird and young Gladwell, who conducted a barber shop at Marlinton, had been sweethearts for some months, although the girl's father seriously objected to the companionship. On yesterday week they decided they would elope to Virginia and get married. They stopped at Ratliff's farm, about four miles from Marlinton, for the purpose of spending the night there. Ratliff was not at home. When the couple started away they saw Ratliff and Gay coming toward the house.

Ratliff and his companion were drunk and had a jug of whisky in the wagon in which they drove to the farm. Gladwell informed Ratliff he and the girl wished to spend the night in his house, and also said they wanted to be driven to Virginia to be married. As soon as Ratliff heard the plans he called Gay aside and the two whispered together for some moments.

Then Ratliff answered that he intended taking the girl away from Gladwell, and before the frightened youth and girl could run Ratliff darted into the house, got a Winchester rifle and cartridges, and leveled the weapon at Gladwell's head. He held the would-be bridegroom off while Gay took the girl into the farm house and attacked her.

The girl freed herself from his grasp and ran from the house, but Ratliff seized her and held her for a few minutes; then, releasing her, he covered both the girl and her lover with a rifle and ordered Gay to saddle two of the fastest horses in the stable. Gay obeyed immediately, and when the saddled horses were brought to the front of the house, Ratliff threw the girl on one of the animals while he jumped on the other. Gay was then ordered to get another gun and two blankets for Ratliff, who had Gladwell at bay while on the horse.

When the blankets and gun were handed to him, Ratliff seized the bridle of the girl's horse and rode off at breakneck speed. He took Miss Bird to a lonely spot on Marlinton Mountain, half way between his home and Marlinton. After throwing the gun and blankets to the ground he tied his horse and then made the girl his victim. Then he coolly informed her that she must die.

She begged to be allowed to pray. Ratliff said he would kill her instantly if she uttered a word of prayer.

Meanwhile Gladwell had escaped from his drunken guardian, and made his way to the home of Chief Yeager. Between grasps for breath and sobs he hurriedly told the story of horror.

Chief Yeager awakened the girl's father, and the two, armed with revolvers and Winchester, went in search of the fiends, twenty-one minutes after they were informed of the outrage.

Chief Yeager and Justice of the Peace Bird came upon the lonely spot where the girl had been subjected to brutal indignities. Chief Yeager was within forty yards of Ratliff when the latter saw him and ran.

Chief Yeager fired, but missed, and Ratliff attempted to hide.

The chief and justice gave their attention to the girl, who was hysterical. She was finally quieted, and told her story, which caused her father to cry out for the blood of her assailant. Chief Yeager descended the hill, and was about to shoot at a clump of rustling bushes, when Ratliff sprang up and shouted: "Don't shoot me, Paris; I'll surrender!"

When the chief placed the girl's assailant on a horse and started to town with him, Judge Bird fired at Ratliff, first with a revolver and later with a rifle. Both charges went directly over Chief Yeager's shoulders, and he now marvels at a escape from death.

Miss Bird is in a precarious condition. The family physician has been in constant attendance since the outrage was committed, and says that if the little girl recovers, she will more than likely be of unsound mind for the rest of her days. Miss Bird, because of her six hours' experience with Gay and Ratliff, has been unable to talk coherently or make herself understood by her relatives. She tumbles and tosses on her bed, and writes in unimaginable script.

Hartje Case Perjuror Sentenced.

William B. De Costa, colored, who was convicted of perjury in connection with the trial of Chief Hooe, the negro coachman, formerly in the employ of Augustus Harjo, was yesterday at Pittsburg sentenced to serve two years in the Western penitentiary. Hooe is serving a sentence in the same penal institution, having been convicted on a similar charge, and with the incarceration of De Costa there closes a second chapter of the sequel to the sensational Harjo divorce proceedings.

The next will probably be the trial of the libellant, Augustus Harjo, and John L. Welshon on the charge of conspiracy, and when these cases have been disposed of there will remain only the indictments against Sias and Anderson, the two detectives, who have been granted a new trial on the charge of riding the trunk of Thomas Madine, the coachman co-repondent.
