SHORT IN HIS ACCOUNTS.

It developed Saturday that when Capt. William E. Gunn, the absent manager of the Schuyler Arms Apartment Hotel, in New York, hurried off to Europe he took a bride with him. She had been Miss Gertrude Fentham, a pretty stengraber, and they were married on September 23.

While the couple are in Europe presumably enjoying their honeymoon, two unpleasant disclosures were made Saturday which may dishearten the young wife. A shortage of \$5,400 has been found in the Apartment House accounts, and persons who claimed to have known Gunn before he came East declared he has a wife and three children in California.

For several months Miss Fentham had been engaged to a young lawyer on Park Row. He knew nothing of the new attachment which his sweetheart had formed for her employer until he got a telephone message from her one afternoon about two weeks ago announcing her marriage to Gunn.

Although she is only 23 years old, this is the second time Miss Fentham has figured in a romance that turned out badly. Just two years ago Dr. William W. Wood, a dentist, and Lester F. Dwight, a chief electrician, who were roommates, quarreled over the affections of Miss Fentham. Wood, it seemed, had been courting her, and finding that Dwight was beginning to pay attentions to the girl, he upbraided him. Both men are said to have drawn guns, but Wood was the quicker. Dwight was shot in four places. For a time it was believed the electrician would die, but after spending several weeks at the J. Hood Wright Hospital he recovered.

MURDER AND SUICIDE.

In a jealous rage, Albert Fiedler, aged 45 years, a milk dealer of Baltimore, fired five shots into the body of his wife, Ida, yesterday afternoon, shortly before 4 o'clock in the parlor of his wife's home, at 209 South Duncan alley, and then turned the revolver to his right temple and sent a bullet through his brain. The wife died instantly, but the man lingered a few minutes, dying in the Eastern district police ambulance on the way to the John Hopkins Hospital. It is said by associates and relatives of the man who murdered his wife and then killed himself that he suffered from a peculiar form of hallucination.

After the marriage the couple moved into a home for themselves, and they saved several thousand dollars. Three years after the marriage Fiedler sold his business, put the money in bank and for the past nine years he had done very little work. For the past three years it is charged that he had refused to support his wife and children, except to give them a few dollars at intervals. For several years the family lived in a house on south Grove street, and it was during this time that jealousy of an insane nature is said to have possessed the man.

Fiedler was so jealous of his wife that he had electric bells placed in his bedroom which connected with the front and back doors. He spent most of his time in the room, and every time the bell rang he would rush down stairs to see who entered or left the house. This peculiar action, the brother-in-law said, was due to a hallucination on the part of Fiedler that a man was visiting his wife. In his room, Mr. Barnock said, the man kept a shotgun, two revolvers of the best make, an axe and a club, and he threatened to kill the man of his hallucination on sight.
