## SUBMARINE BATTLE.

Armed with a bathhook and 10 feet under water, Alexander Anderson, a powerful longshoreman, put up a fight against saving his life yesterday which makes Victor Hugo's submarine duel in the "Toilers of the Sea" a lot of its glare as a thriller. Anderson was rescued, despite his struggles to die, but he sent his captor to the hospital, and he will succumb to the blows he received as his rescuer occasionally arose to the surface.

The duel took place in the East river. Darting out of his lodging-house, Anderson ran almost to the water's edge, shouting at the top of his voice. Near the foot of Hamilton avenue he seized a bathhook and stood his ground, mumbling and shrieking in his Swedish dialect and brandishing his weapon.

Robert Stevens was the first to get near him. Anderson knew of Stevens' prowess and, evidently, did not relish a combat with his powerful frame.

He had enough sense left to know that he would have a better chance in the water with Stevens, who is six feet tall and muscular, so Anderson jumped into the river, carrying his hook with him. Stevens followed. He dived directly where Anderson's form was last seen.

No one knows just what happened under the water. Several persons, who gathered on the pier, say that every few seconds an arm or a leg would appear above, and once Stevens' face arose, showing a great gash down the right side. Once Anderson reached the surface and swung his hook savagely downward. A stiffness followed, and only bubbles showed that life remained below the water. In a few seconds Stevens came up and feebly cried for help.

Charles Walsh, who had arrived during the struggle and was vainly trying to learn the cause of the excitement, jumped in. He found one of Stevens' hands clutching the Swede by the neck. Anderson was unconscious and Stevens was fast losing the little strength that remained when they were rescued.

## JAPAN LIMITS EMIGRATION.

The government's desire to avoid future emigration complications are shown by the restrictions just placed upon emigration companies in Japan. The enforcement of a deposit of 50,000 yen has already brought about the dissolution of six of the more irresponsible companies, which fattened on the business to Hawaii and California. It is believed a number of others will collapse on account of this deposit and the prospect of stricter government regulations, involved in the newly created Colonial Bureau of the Foreign Office, whose business will be to supervise all emigration. Trusty companies have been actively engaged. Probably half will be eliminated.

Realizing that the trouble with the United States and Canada comes primarily from the Japanese leaving Hawaii, the Government has issued orders restricting the number that each company may send to Hawaii to 25 a month, of whom not more than 18 shall be men. This is designed to meet the objection heretofore raised that immigrants are mostly men.

The prospect of strict government supervision is not enjoyed by the companies, who anticipate destruction of a hitherto lucrative business. The press generally indorses it on the ground that it insures proper protection of Japanese emigrants at the hands of the companies, and will serve to remove the possibilities of international complications.

A substantial movement to direct the emigration stream to Korea is seen in the organization with the companies, the approval of the Oriental Colonial Company. The company plans to purchase waste Korean lands for lease or sale to Japanese immigrants on easy terms.
