### WANTS HERETICS HANGED.

Rev. Robert M. Patterson, pastor of the Great Valley Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia, started a large number of his brother ministers at their weekly meeting yesterday afternoon by advocating the death penalty for the assailants of women, the despoilers of homes and heretics.

"Every scoundrel, rich or poor," said Dr. Patterson, "who ruins a young girl by force I would have swept into eternity. I would hand over to the executioner the guilty party making a divorce necessary. Murder should not be the only crime with a death penalty. Our whole penal code needs revision. Those who deliberately spread blasphemous, heretical and immoral doctrines should also be put to death."

Several ministers objected to such radical talk. Rev. Dr. Henry C. McCook made a spirited reply. "My blood boiled," said he, "as I heard some of the sentences which have just been uttered. I doubt if there is another man, and I certainly hope there is not, in the Presbyterian Church who would have spoken them."

"Who shall be the judge of what is blasphemous, heretical or immoral? Should we be judged by some ladies we should all be condemned. I marvel that Dr. Patterson's sentiments should be called radical. They are so ultra-conservative that they hark back to the times of mediæval persecution."

"In regard to the assailants of women I have always contended that they should be deprived of the means of repeating such crimes, and I still hold this view. Dr. Patterson was eloquent as ever. He has not lost his force, but he must have lost his head when he made such an address to this assemblage."

### ATTACKS BOOK OF JONAH.

"I do not believe one word of the Book of Jonah as history," was the surprising declaration with which Rev. Charles F. Aked, pastor of the Fifth Avenue Baptist Church, New York—John D. Rockefeller's church—opened his sermon Sunday night.

Not only was the historical narrative of Jonah cast to the winds, but the prophets—as men inspired of God to foretell the birth of Christ and other future events—were wiped from the region of fact.

"There is no forecasting of events and no such inspiration," declared Dr. Aked. "The story of Jonah is a parable; in fact it is fiction," declared the preacher. "But it is radiant with prophecy."

Dr. Aked's conception of Jonah is that the book concerning him is "one of the greatest and most valuable books in the Bible."

At his home Sunday night Dr. Aked went more into detail regarding his view of the story of Jonah. Jonah, he said, was not a real person, and his events recited in four chapters of the Bible never occurred. Some man, whose name even is not known, but of the broadest mental grasp and a deeper and fuller realization of God's limitless love and vast purposes, told the story, to illustrate to the Jews how God in His own good time would extend redemption, not to the "Chosen People" only, but to the men of every tribe and nation, then despised by the Jews, Dr. Aked said.

### TWO CHILDREN KILLED.

Matthew Gluevski, five years old, and his sister, Lucy, eleven years old, were run down by a Lake Shore train and killed Sunday night on a crossing near Amherst, Ohio, and their aunt, Miss Sophia Glover, was fatally hurt.

The three were walking on the track when the boy's foot became fastened in a cattle guard. In attempting to rescue him his sister also caught her foot in the guard. The children called their aunt, who was walking ahead, for assistance. The woman was unable to pull the children's feet from the cattle guard, and had stopped to unlace the little boy's shoe when she look up to see a freight train bearing down upon him.

The children were killed instantly, and the aunt's right leg was broken in two places, her right shoulder crushed, and her head badly hurt. She will die.

### TRAINS ENTER STRASBURG.

Beginning today the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company will operate its trains into Strasburg. This is the result of the case which has been pending between Strasburg and the Baltimore and Ohio and which was taken before the State Corporation Commission. Since the Southern got possession of the tracks between Strasburg Junction and Harrisonburg, December, 1896, the Baltimore and Ohio has only operated its trains to the junction, one mile from town. The original charter of the company specified Caton Crossing, in Strasburg. Upon this charter the commission ordered the Baltimore and Ohio to run its trains into town over the Southern tracks.
