FEDERATION OF LABOR

Numerous resolutions, dealing with big and important questions, were introduced before the convention of the American Federation of Labor at Norfolk yesterday. It calls for all union men to hold aloof from military organizations until the "militia system in vogue in Switzerland, or some other orderly and well-organized method of arming every sober and reputable citizen, is adopted in the United States."

Another resolution would have Congress, in times of industrial crisis, authorize the issuing of money by the national government to States, counties and cities, for the purpose of building highways, bridges and public utilities, provided, however, that such work be done at union wages and under the eight-hour law.

The government is also asked to lend a helping hand to labor in another resolution offered in view of its "having hastened to lend a helping hand to the members and speculators of Wall street, by pouring millions into their coffers, so that money should be available to them at low interest," the money so loaned to labor to be repaid at low interest. Victor L. Berger, socialist, of Milwaukee, is the patron of this resolution.

A resolution was introduced by the Porto Rican delegates providing for a committee headed by Samuel Gompers, and of which they shall be members, to visit President Roosevelt within twelve days after the adjournment of the convention, and asked certain reforms in Porto Rico, chief among which are the full American citizenship to be granted the Porto Ricans; that the eight-hour day and American liability act be enforced there; that convict labor be abolished; that the salaries of school teachers equal those paid in the United States; that the annual school fund be doubled, and that the destruction of \$30,000 worth of school books by the Department of Education be investigated.

DEUEL IN THE WOODS.

A dispatch from East Radford, Va., says: In a duel following a chance encounter in the woods while hunting, near Capens, Litchia Springs, yesterday afternoon, James Newby, keeper of the springs, was fatally wounded, and Hugh Peterman, a farmer living in the vicinity, was shot, and is in a critical condition. The feud between the two men began about a year ago, and resulted from jealousy on the part of Peterman, who imagined that Newby was paying attention to his wife, while in reality it was Mrs. Peterman's sister whom he was courting. Peterman's jealousy led him to threaten the life of his wife, and she left him and secured a divorce in the spring. Newby married a sister during the summer. The men had not met since the divorce until yesterday, when chance threw them together while hunting. Newby was shot in the breast and neck and his death is momentarily expected. Peterman was riddled with shot from his hips down to his feet. Peterman was found by his brother-in-law about an hour after the shooting. He said he thought he had killed Newby, as he emptied five loads into his body. Men were dispatched to make search for Newby, but he was found at his home, a neighbor having met him and assisted him home.

DEATH OF OLD TELEGRAPHER.

William F. Shiebler, who received the first message over the Atlantic cable, sent by Queen Victoria to President Buchanan, and who delivered it personally to the President, scolding his answer to the Queen, died at his home in Brooklyn yesterday after a month's illness of a complication of diseases. He had been suffering for years, but his indomitable will kept him up to the last.

Mr. Shiebler was born in Baltimore, and was in the sixty-sixth year of his age at the time of his death. When a boy, he was employed as a messenger by the telegraph office at Baltimore, and latter went to Washington as an operator. It was while holding his place that he received and sent the message alluded to. He also received the message from the front, announcing the fall of Richmond, at the close of the civil war. Mr. Shiebler was present at the assassination of Lincoln, and was among the first to reach the stage after the shooting. He also operated and had charge of the first military telegraph station in the civil war.
