MRS. MAITH ACQUITTED.

Mrs. Annie E. Maith, who shot and killed Mrs. Sallie Brown when she found Mrs. Brown in the company of her husband, was acquitted by a jury in the Criminal Court in Baltimore yesterday. Her defense was insanity, but the jury simply found her not guilty, saying nothing about insanity, thus upholding the unwritten law.

The evidence showed that Maith had ill-treated his wife, and that she had asked a court for a divorce. In spite of this she loved Maith, and when Maith's attorney in the divorce proceedings threatened to jail Maith because the fee had not been paid, Mrs. Maith sewed far into the night to raise money to pay the lawyer. She also pawned her gold watch.

Mrs. Maith testified that the Brown woman had broken up her home, robbed her of her husband, and made her home wretched. She said that she had gone repeatedly to the woman and begged and implored her to let her husband alone, and that she was scolded and jested at and called names.

She had collected the money her husband wanted and was on her way to tell him of his good fortune when she found him in the home of Mrs. Brown.

"I told her," said Mrs. Maith, "that she was doing me a great wrong, that she knew I was in ill health and not able to take care of myself. On the night I went to Mrs. Brown's house I looked through the parlor window and saw my husband and Sallie Brown together."

"After he had gone, I went into the house and asked her why she did not leave my husband alone. She replied: 'I don't have to,' and then tried to grab me. After that I scarcely know just what happened."

Mrs. Maith fired two shots from a revolver she carried in the folds of her dress, killing her rival instantly.

CLIFF MILLS.

A fire at Cliff Mills' Friday night, wept nearly every building that was left of that once flourishing and picturesque hamlet. It started in the store about 11 o'clock, the night that the whole Atlantic slope was in the throes of a terrible storm, and destroyed the building where there was a general store and postoffice, kept by Mr. E. C. Parr, though the building was owned by Mr. Hugh Moffet. It then extended to the mill which belonged to E. C. Parr and the "Cliff House." There was some insurance by Hutton and Payne.

Cliff Mills was at one time the most picturesque spot in the country. Carter's Run nowhere else has banks so beautiful between which it winds up to the mill. Just beyond formerly stood the "Poplar Hill House" the home of the Digges family. On the roadside were a miller's house and residences for several other families, to which were added the cleanest of white washed cottages for the laborers.

It was so still and peaceful, when out of sound of the mill, a passer-by pausing, heard nothing but the faintest ripple of the water and the old clocks beating time in the cottages close to the road.

The Poplar Hill House was burned some years ago. The unaided struggle of the jonquils to blossom in the spring, are all that are left to tell where the kindest and best of people once lived. One by one the houses decayed and fell down.

The fire Friday night took all that remained except one half rotten building which gives additional sadness to the scene of desolation, through which the little stream flows on careless what hand for its little day, pulls the flowers that bloom on its everlasting shore.—[Warrenton Virginian.]
