PRESIDENT WANTS MORE SHIPS.

President Roosevelt called the democratic members of the House committee on naval affairs to the White House yesterday and urged them to support his entire naval programme, saying that the international relations of the United States at this time render naval preparedness for war absolutely necessary. The President specifically mentioned the trouble with Japan. He narrated the whole course of the negotiations over the questions with Japan and spoke of these issues as being unsettled and still serious. Therefore, he asked the democrats, not as "politicians," but as "patriots," to vote for the four new 20,000-ton battleships, four scout cruisers and an auxiliary fleet of destroyers, submarines and ammunition and mine ships, as recommended by Congress in his annual message and in the naval estimates. The strictest possible injunction of secrecy was put upon those present as to all the details of the President's talk upon international matters. Only one additional point creeps out, and it is that more significance attached to the withdrawal of Japanese Ambassador Aoki than has been officially made known in the past. The democratic conference invited to the President's sanctum came away from the White House visibly impressed with the position taken by the President. They were frank to say that, if the President's view of the situation is well founded, the battleship programme should be carried through Congress. It now seems certain that the President's programme will receive a larger number of democratic votes when the issue on the naval bill comes before the House.

The House naval affairs committee, despite the recommendations of President Roosevelt, has decided to recommend the construction of only two battleships.

In the face of this statement by the President, a dispatch from London reports the Japanese Ambassador to Washington, Baron Kogoro Takahira as saying: "I know of no truer friends of Japan than the Americans, and our excellent relations and knowledge of one another will insure an amicable outcome at an early date of the negotiations still in progress. I have always regarded the Americans as our good friends, and friendship in times of stress and difficulty is doubly appreciated. That is why I say I know Japan has no truer friends than the Americans who all along have believed in the justice and truth of our aims. Although certain newspapers have spoken in a pessimistic vein regarding our relations, I have never attached the slightest importance to these utterances, and with my knowledge of America's attitude during the Russo-Japanese war, and of her relations to us in our earlier and more modest times, I have never dreamed of the possibility of war between the United States and Japan. Such a thing is unthinkable in this period of the world's history."

Chicago, Feb. 7.—France will let the United States experiment with trial marriages first, according to M. Henri Labrousse, editor of the Temps, who is spending several days in Chicago on a tour across this country. He declared as a matter of fact, all marriages in America, even now, are trial marriages if what has been told him is true.

"Adopt the idea in France! We will leave to America to try it and if it is a success we may adopt it. I really think that some improvement in the style of marriage might be well. Styles in everything change, even in religion, so we may see the day when there will be a 'marriage a la mode' and an 'old style marriage.'" Editor Labrousse gallantly refuted the libel on Chicago women that they have large feet.
