PROPOSED CHURCH UNION.

Archbishop Ryan, of Philadelphia, thinks there may be a corporate union of Anglicans and Episcopalians with the Catholic Church in the near future. Asked for his views on the Romeward move which ministers and laymen of the Protestant Episcopal Church crystallized at a meeting in New York Monday evening, the archbishop said:

"The present movement among Episcopalians in this country in the one Lord Fairfax and a great party in England belong to, looking toward reunion with Rome. There can be no question that there is such a movement in the Episcopal Church. I think a great many Episcopalians will come into the Catholic Church individually, and there may be a corporate union."

Archbishop Ryan was asked if the Episcopal clergy could be received into the Catholic Church in a body and recognized as priests. He replied:

"They are not priests. They would have to be ordained. The clergy of the Greek church are priests, and when a number of them came into the Catholic Church their orders were recognized as valid."

Asked as to the terms on which the Anglicans or Episcopalians might enter the Catholic Church in a body, the archbishop said that would be arranged by agreement with the Pope.

"It is the height of foolishness," said the Rev. Dr. G. M. Christian, rector of the Episcopal Church of St. Mary the Virgin, in New York, yesterday, "to talk of uniting the Episcopal and Roman Catholic churches, which at the present time are irreparably separated."

MRS. MACDONALD ACQUITTED.

Mrs. Dora McDonald, who has been on trial in Chicago since January 20 on the charge of murdering Webster Guerin an artist, was acquitted by a jury in the Criminal Court last night. The verdict was reached after six and a half hours of deliberation. The defendant is the widow of Michael C. McDonald, once a political leader in Chicago, the gambler king, and later a traction magnate. He developed at the trial just concluded that Guerin and Mrs. Dora McDonald had been more or less intimate for almost ten years, their relations having begun when Guerin was less than seventeen years old. The State asserted that Guerin had attempted to dissolve these relations, and that the woman shot him in a jealous rage. The defense attacked Guerin's character, asserting that he had systematically blackmailed Mrs. McDonald for years by threatening to reveal their relations to her husband, and offered evidence tending to show that he had attacked her in his studio on the day of the tragedy.

VICTIM OF ROBBERY.

One of the most heinous robberies recorded in southern west Virginia in years was that which came to light Monday morning in Mingo county, two miles from Nangetuck, W. Va. Some hunters passing through a woodland not far from the Norfolk and Western Railway tracks found the almost lifeless body of Reel Hatfield, 30 years of age, who lives near Pikeville, Ky. Hatfield's hands and feet were tied. He was unconscious when picked up and his hands, arms, feet and ears were frozen. Physicians who were summoned failed to revive him. Hatfield is a miner, and last Friday he told friends he was going to his home in Kentucky, as work has been slack. He was known to have had over \$100 in money, and the presumption is that while walking to the station along the railroad track Friday night, to depart on a midnight train, he was ambushed and robbed. Physicians say that both of Hatfield's feet will have to be amputated and that probably one arm will also have to be taken off. Had not Hatfield been found that day he would no doubt have perished where he lay.

FROZE TO DEATH.

His clothing saturated with blood and particles of flesh clinging to his trousers legs, the dead body of Tom McPherson, of Hagerstown, Md., was found yesterday in the mountains about a mile from Smoketown. The place where the body was found and the condition of the body, the officers say, prove conclusively that McPherson murdered his sister, Mrs. Jane Bowers, at Pleasant Walk, last Friday night, and that he wandered out into the mountain and froze to death. The crime was most heinous, the body of Mrs. Bowers having been literally chopped to pieces. McPherson, who had been in poor health, had gone to the home of his sister to recuperate. He was never seen alive after the murder. It is believed that the murder followed a quarrel between sister and brother.
