THE MURDERED PRIEST.

Most of the priests of the Roman Catholic Church in Denver, Colo., believe that Father Leo Heinrichs, who was murdered by Giuseppe Alio, an Italian anarchist, while giving communion in St. Elizabeth's Church in that city on Sunday last, was a marked man from the time he arrived in town last August, or even before. The dead priest was stationed previously in Paterson, N. J., and it is believed that he may have incurred the enmity of the anarchists there, and that a plot was laid to kill him, perhaps prior to his leaving Paterson, but that the machinery of the "Reds" failed to get into working order until Alio carried out orders.

That Father Leo lived a life of severe austerity is evidenced by a discovery made in preparing the body for burial. Next to the skin Father Leo had wrapped about his waist and upper arms heavy bands of linked steel chains, and to each link was a hook, sharpened to a needle's point, attached in such fashion that each movement of the priest caused the hooks to pierce his flesh and to remind him of the life and death of Him in whose steps he struggled to follow.

Father Leo never spoke to his fellow-clergy of his mode of penance, and no one in the monastery surmised it. His body and upper arms were calloused entirely, showing that when the pain became desisted because of the toughened skin he had taken the network of chains and adjusted them so that the pain might come again with renewed force.

STORIES OF CANNIBALISM.

Rev. Father E. X. Lichtenberg, for eight years a missionary among the savages of Nigeria, central Africa, and who is visiting friends in St. Louis, related tales of cannibalism and savagery which many perhaps would not credit were it not for photographic evidence, together with the priest's high character.

That he has been able to return to civilization to relate his experiences the priest attributes to Providence. He said that four of the band that accompanied him from Paris became food for the savages. Father Lichtenberg saw fossils on human beings with his own eyes. Men and women, he said, were fattened before being killed and eaten.

Women captured from other tribes were marched from hut to hut and various portions of their bodies were marked off with colored clay, and these "choice bits" were sent to the purchasers after the victim had been slaughtered.

"Old men and women," said Father Lichtenberg, "are softened for the feast just as we might treat celery. When the supply of girls gave out, they placed the old men in a river or in some kind of water up to their necks and kept them there for two or three days, all the time feeding them liberally. The idea was to fatten and at the same time soften them."

Czar Holds Reception.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 26.—Czar Nicholas and his consort received 200 members of the Douma at Trankoe-Zelo today. The invitation was general, but the constitutional democrats, radicals and Poles preferred, for political reasons, not to go. The Czar himself arranged the reception, having expressed a wish for some time to meet the national lawmakers personally. He was exceedingly gracious to his visitors, many of whom seemed fairly overcome by the honor done them by royalty. With those, not too much confused to talk at all, his majesty held an animated conversation. Political matters, however, were not touched on. The Czars, though present at the audience, looked exceedingly weak and ill and plainly showed she was relieved when it was all over.


