Asylum Destroyed.

Norriatown, Pa., July 10.—Over 2,000 inmates of the state insane asylum were thrown into a panic today when a fire destroyed the house and barn of the asylum steward and threatened a nearby cottage in which were housed a large number of women inmates. All, however, escaped. The fire loss is \$75,000.

Awaits Son with a Slipper

New Haven, Conn., July 10.—Furious that Burr S. Peck, her seventy-seven-year-old son, had married May Bryan, who says she is 22, in New York yesterday, Mrs. Sarah Peck, aged 95, prepared today to welcome him with a slipper when he arrives. Peck, who is a real estate dealer, was wedded by Alderman Goldschmidt in the New York City Hall. He at first had difficulty in getting a license. Convinced that the aged man was the bridegroom, the license was finally issued and the ceremony performed. "I'll have his marriage annulled," said mother Peck today. "The idea of my boy eloping; I'll show him. Wait till he gets home."

Bookmakers Indicted.

New York, July 10.—Twenty-two bookmakers, among them many of prominence of eastern tracks were indicted today by the Kings county grand jury for violation of the betting law. Bail was fixed in \$500 in each case and the bookmakers were paroled for 24 hours to permit them to get bondsmen.

More Trouble in Servia.

Vienna, July 10.—Rumors of a most startling revolutionary development in Servia reached Vienna today. Owing to an interruption in the telegraph service the stories could not be confirmed, but it is known that King Peter is concentrating troops in Belgrade, the Servian capital, to repel the threatened attack.
The loyalty of the crown troops is doubted and King Peter is in a state of fear bordering on collapse. There are rumors that the same fate awaits the royal household as befell King Alexander and Queen Draga, who were slain in the late five years ago by a mob which was in league with the palace guard.
Peter has appealed to the czar for aid in the crisis that now confronts the throne.

GOMPERS & CO. SUEDE.

While Samuel Gompers, John Mitchell, John H. Lennon, Frank Morrison, Joseph Valentine, James Duncan, and Max Morris were holding a conference on labor matters in Denver yesterday, Deputy Sheriff Thomas Lawson served them with papers to appear as defendants in a suit brought by the W. E. Thompson Marble Company, against them as leading officers of the American Federation of Labor, for \$50,000 for alleged damages to its business by a strike and boycott. These officers will have to appear before a commissioner July 15 to give testimony, and this will keep them in Denver a week longer than they intended to stay. The trial has been set for August 4. Officers of the Colorado State Federation of Labor and the Denver Building Trades Council are codefendants.
