### GERMANY'S STRENGTH.

In showing nearly a million soldiers into the forthcoming army maneuvers, German military leaders see a design on the part of the Kaiser to impress the world with the fighting strength of Germany.

Following the record breaking naval maneuvers of England, in the North sea, the sending of the American fleet on a cruise around the world, the closer alliance between England and Russia, and Russia and France, and the loss of German prestige by the unexpected turn affairs have taken in Turkey, Emperor William plans the greatest peaceful demonstration by the German troops that the world has ever seen. Critics are already assailing the emperor for the needless expense of such a gigantic maneuver. Nearly three hundred thousand men are to be taken from the reserves and added to the peace army of 626,346 in the fall movements.

### JAPAN'S NAVY.

According to a tabulation by the German Navy League, made public yesterday, Japan will be the third strongest naval power in the world in 1911, being surpassed only by England and the United States.

The miki-do will have at his command at that time, the report says, 17 battleships, with a total tonnage of 262,200; 16 large cruisers, with a tonnage of 179,900; with the possibility of four additional battleships of 33,200 tonnage and five cruisers of 92,500 tons, that have been provided for.

This tremendous growth in naval power will send Japan ahead of France and Germany.

### LABOR UNION FOR GOMPERS.

The Central Labor Union of Indianapolis Ind., in which all the Labor Unions are represented, has adopted a resolution commending Samuel Gompers for his attitude toward the anti-injunction law, and it was mailed to him today.

The preamble declared that the enemies of organized labor had resorted to every effort to discredit the officers of the American Federation of Labor, and that "President Roosevelt, the highest executive in the land, has recently shown a greater contempt for the courts than has ever been shown by any officer of the American Federation of Labor or any member of organized labor." It concludes as follows:

"Resolved, That we, the delegates to the Central Labor Union of Indianapolis, Ind., commend the action of President Gompers and the executive council of the American Federation of Labor in the stand they have taken in defense of the rights of labor; and do be it further

"Resolved, That we condemn the unjust attitude of certain judges of the courts in their unfair and unjust decisions rendered against the members of organized labor, and pledge ourselves to render any assistance in our power to carry out the policy as outlined by the executive council of the American Federation of Labor in their efforts to obtain justice for organized labor and the workmen in general in the coming campaign."
