## Many Heroic Rescues.

Spokane, Wash., August 4.—Many acts of heroism are reported during the two and a half hour fire at West Fernie, Wash., was like a seething furnace. W. T. Healy, of West Fernie, while crossing the traffic bridge over the Elk river, came upon a little girl lying face downward in the dust, and picking her up discovered that she was alive, and, putting her on his back, retraced his steps, and in some way reached the brick plant at the south end of West Fernie.

Charles Erickson, of West Fernie, a carpenter, found a young girl who had just risen from a sick bed sitting in the door of a cabin holding a small baby in her arms. The girl did not know what had become of her parents, and the fire was fast coming on the cabin. Erickson seized the girl, who was clothed only in a nightgown, under one arm, and the baby under the other, and carried them to the Great Northern tracks below the fire.

Two other little girls, who had lost their parents, were found by Erickson and carried to safety, after which he returned and found two old women in a cabin. One of the women refused to leave the house, and Erickson was compelled to take her out by force to save her life.

An old woman 90 years of age was carried by John Volume on his back from the Port Steele Brewery, below town, to the Crow's Nest Coal Company's office, over a mile. The old woman pleaded to be left to the mercy of the flames, telling her rescuer to devote his time to saving more useful lives.

## Praises Eve for Eating The Apple.

San Francisco, Aug. 5.—After a patient wait of some thousands of years, Eve, the mother of the race, was justified by her own sex yesterday and received praise for her conduct in regard to the much discussed apple. Dr. Jessica Peixotto, assistant professor of sociology at the state university, said the words of praise and was enthusiastically applauded by the women of the California Club.

"We have an instance of woman's position in life as far back as Genesis itself," said Dr. Peixotto, who was addressing the members of the club on woman's attitude toward the world and its work.

"In the story of the tree of knowledge Eve's conduct has long been called insufferably curious, rebellious and disobedient. But we of this day are beginning to put a new interpretation upon what Eve did and to feel that the tree of knowledge is well worth tasting. Eve took the initiative and ate of the fruit and ever since her position has been the same—that of reaching out for what would teach her something."

"There has been a big change since the days when women were the slaves of the world and merely cooked and worked and followed the men of their tribes. Now, on the contrary, we are beginning to let the other extreme gain a foothold. For instance, you are entirely, at leisure most of the time, and yet ever occur to you that we women in this day actually have all the leisure that there is in the world. And to give it to us men must work day and night, and are too busy to read, to think, to eat and sleep because of it. This is half a woman's world, of course, but don't forget that it's half a man's world, too, and prepare to take a more earnest and responsible share in the work of the world."

Lalley finally sent a letter to the girl, in which he asked her to become his wife. He also sent a note to the father asking him to consent to the marriage. The count and his daughter agreed to come to this country. Lalley met them in Dustin, Okla., and eloped with the girl.

The count learned that Lalley was a railroad section foreman, and he hastened to his son-in-law's shack. He found the bride in tears and pleading to be taken home.
