## KILLED IN PISTOL FIGHT.

John Johns, colored, proprietor of a clothes establishment, in Petersburg, was shot and instantly killed by William L. Ellis, a colored liverman, yesterday. Johns, who rented from Ellis, had a quarrel with Ellis regarding the roof of his store, which had been leaking. The quarrel was followed by a fight, in which Johns was worsted, and Ellis took a pistol away from him.

After the fight Johns went to his store, and procuring another pistol, started in the direction of Ellis's stable. William Armistead, a friend, attempted to remonstrate with him, but he turned and fired on Armistead, the ball striking Armistead in the mouth, tearing a hole in the roof of his mouth and lodging at the base of his skull. Armistead was taken to the hospital.

Ellis was standing in a room in the front of his stable in Bollingbrook street, when Johns turned the corner of the street and opened fire on him. Ellis picked up the pistol that he had taken from Johns about 15 minutes before and fired at Johns. The two men exchanged several shots, when Johns was seen to stagger and fall. An examination showed that Johns had been struck by one of Ellis's shots in the right breast, the bullet penetrating the lung and causing instant death. Ellis went at once to police headquarters and surrendered. Ellis claims self-defense.

## CRABS SWEET SEAWARD.

Captain Olsen, of the Norwegian steamship Captain Bennett, which arrived at Philadelphia Wednesday from Jamaica, found a big area of oil off the North Carolina coast, evidently the cargo of some petroleum carrier or whaler which may have foundered in the recent storm. He says that when north of Cape Hatteras his vessel passed through oil floating on the surface of the water covering an area of more than 100 miles, extending in all directions. Within the petroleum area the oil had killed the sea, and it was as calm as the Delaware river on a summer day. Another unusual thing reported by Captain Olsen was the number of crabs seen in the water south of Cape Henry. Thousands of them were in view—evidently having been carried out to sea from the Chesapeake Bay by the recent storms and were unable to get back to the inland waters again.

## KILLED A THIEF.

It developed yesterday that a series of robberies which have been systematically conducted at the railroad wharves at Port Norfolk and Pinner's Point culminated last night in a tragedy. The fact was disclosed when the bullet-riddled body of Daniel Bullock, of Mount Herman, was found floating in the water. Watchman Ironmonger Wednesday night discovered two men stealing groceries from the wharf of the New York, Philadelphia and Norfolk Railroad at Port Norfolk. The watchman pursued them, and as they were about to jump from the wharf to a small skiff which they had brought along for the purpose of carrying off their booty he fired several shots at them. In their haste to leave they turned the boat over, and it was not known at that time by the watchman that any of his shots had taken effect. He was under the impression that both men had made their way ashore, although neither made a noise after the boat turned turtle.

## HEAT CAUSES INSANITY.

His mind unbalanced by work and heat, Norman C. Bassett, aged 50, manager of a department of the Allis-Chalmers' plant, at Milwaukee, Wis., wandered for several hours about town Tuesday night, until a patrolman took him to the police station.  
 He carried a satchel, which was found to contain \$50,000 in money, bonds and other paper.  
 When taken into custody Bassett talked incoherently, was unable to tell anything about himself, even his name, and imagined he was in a foreign city pursued by thieves. He is being kept at Emergency Hospital until relatives in New England are heard from. Bassett is unmarried, and has no relatives in Milwaukee. He is a man of means.
