GIRL FIGHTS BULL.

To save her father's life, Marie Jennings, only 12 years old, gave battle to an infuriated bull on the farm where she lives at Markboro, N. J., Monday. Again and again she was knocked down and tossed, but with the aid of a Newfoundland dog she succeeded in subduing the animal, although not until her father had received injuries which will probably cause his death.

Rufus Jennings, who is 55 years old, was in his barnyard in the afternoon when the bull, which had always been considered docile, suddenly attacked him. Catching him unaware, the beast threw him against a fence several times, rained him to the ground and attempted to gore him.

His cries attracted his young daughter and she ran to his aid, with the Newfoundland at her heels. Unmindful of danger to herself, the girl tried to drag her father away from the bull. This further angered the animal, which turned on her.

Thereupon the girl stunned and bruised though she was, caught her half-conscious father and dragged him from the yard, while the battle between the dog and the bull was still waging. The dog escaped as soon as Jennings was safe from further injury.

WHIPPED BY THE JUDGE.

Salvatore Purpura, Leonardo Esperito and Thomas Brindisi, each aged about 12 years, were brought before Judge O'Connor, in the City Court at Utica, N. Y., yesterday afternoon, on the charge of stealing a bicycle. The boys denied the theft with a persistency that could not be shaken.

TO DEVELOP TURKEY.

As an illustration of the country's backwardness and the handicap under which capitalism has suffered, Constantinople, a city of nearly 1,000,000 population, has never had a telephone system because the blackmail demanded by the government grafters precluded all possibility of profit on the franchise.

BLACK HUNDREDS.

Revelation of the crime of the Russian Black Hundreds, organized to punish Jews and political offenders, have so shocked the Russian public that today there is not a man of standing who will admit connection with the bands. Until the organizations degenerated to bands of common murderers and highwaymen, aristocrats and even priests were enrolled in their membership and lent an air of semi-respectability to their outrages. Within the last few days the police have proved several local branches of the group to be providing handsome livings for their members through wanton murders and bold robberies. Several of the leaders have been convicted and sentenced to Siberia.

TO RESTORE LANDS.

The restoration to the government by Sultan Abdul Hamid of crown lands, the annual revenue of which is \$2,000,000, has done more to strengthen the sultan with the dominant young Turks party than anything since the granting of the constitution in the talk of ultimately forcing him to abdicate. All the lands ceded by the sultan will be used as guarantee for new loans which the government will pay off by many debts of long standing and, also, increase its civil list.
