HAVOC OF A HURRICANE.

Only fragmentary reports have yet reached the seat of government at Nassau, Bahamas, as to the damage done to the outlying islands of the dependency which were ravaged by a hurricane on the 11th to the 14th inst., but such news as has arrived is sufficiently bad. The storm appears to have originated near Turks Island, and swept with ever-increasing fury up the long string of islands running southeast from there, Inagua, Acklins, Crooked, Ragged, Long, Fortune, Watlings, Rum Cay, Exuma and the south part of Andros Islands all appear to have suffered. On Long Island the gale blew for two days, and the settlements are practically obliterated from end to end, the principal place, Clarence Town, having only five houses left standing. The inhabitants were forced to find shelter in caves, and food and water are almost unobtainable.

There is no doubt that the less of life is heavy. The whole countryside, even so far as Cat Island, is scalded and burnt as if with fire from the terrible driving of the salt water across the land.

The government has taken relief measures, and schooners are being daily dispatched laden with foodstuffs, lumber and nails. The recent gale is said to have exceeded in fury the hurricane of 1866, which has always been the standard of comparison.

A FIENDISH ATTACK?

The New York police headquarters is puzzled over the declaration of Mrs. Sarah Sample, an aged and well-to-do widow, of the fiendish attack of two women and a man who she says on Saturday overpowered her in her home, gagged her, and stripping her, smeared her whole body with carbolic acid. Mrs. Sample yesterday told the story of a blackmail plot which, she declares, has to do with the assault. Mrs. Sample says she let the upper floors of her house to two families and later one of the men found her in an embarrassing situation with her other tenant, and to save her good name she "gave up" first \$70, then \$500 and again \$500. Tired of being blackmailed, she told her story to Lawyer Owen Finerty, who procured a summons against the man accused, but owing to the peculiarities of Mrs. Sample's story, the police hesitate to make an arrest. Mrs. Sample's experience with the acid bath occurred Saturday. When, in answer to her screams, a policeman broke in the door of her flat, he found her stripped, with a paper of red pepper in her mouth and a bottle with a mixture of red pepper, water and carbolic acid along side her. The woman was not severely injured and as the neighbors below declare they heard no sound of a struggle and saw no one ascend to the Sample flat, the police are non-plussed.

BALLOON BURSTS A MILE HIGH.

Captain von Abercron and Lieutenant von Collabheim, two well-known aeronauts, had a miraculous escape from death yesterday afternoon during the course of an ascent in a spherical balloon at Dusseldorf, Rhenish Prussia, Germany. Thousands of spectators had gathered to witness the ascent, and they were horror-stricken at the accident, which occurred high in the air.

On being released from its fastenings the balloon soared almost directly upward to an altitude of 8,000 feet, when the envelope suddenly ripped open. The gas escaped in streams and the balloon shot downward. The aeronauts swiftly clambered into the network in the desperate hope of avoiding the shock of contact with the ground.

After a fall of 2,000 feet, however, the envelope spread out, seemingly in a purely accidental manner, forming a sort of parachute, which checked the descent. The balloon then gradually came down, taking an hour and a half to reach the earth, the two men clinging to the ropes and the basket. They suffered no injury except a few scratches.

The cause of the accident was the sudden expansion of the gas.

yards of where a "blind tiger" has operated for months. The services had closed and nearly all the congregation had emerged from the church, when a crowd of drunken men who had visited the "blind tiger" began firing into the worshippers with pistols. John Bennett, J. W. McKinney and Edward Thomas were shot down at the church door and died almost instantly. The preacher, Mr. Kind, was mortally wounded.

Another worshiper named Gibson was also shot down in front of the church, but is not mortally wounded. Anthrax is five miles from a railroad and has no telephone connection. Jellico officers could not learn the names of any of the men implicated in the shooting.

All of the dead and wounded were men of families except Bennett.
