TO BE ELECTROCUTED.

For slaying his pretty sweetheart, Miss Amanda Morse, in cold blood, while in a jealous rage, Benjamin F. Gilbert, twenty-two years old, was found guilty of murder in the first degree in Norfolk, yesterday, and if the jury's sentence is carried out he will die in the electric chair.

Gilbert had been paying attention to Miss Morse, and it is said, he thought his suit was gaining favor. Everthing ran smoothly until the parents of the young lady denied Gilbert the privilege of calling.

Gilbert, enraged by jealousy, met his sweetheart on the Compostella bridge. She was with several young men and two girl friends. As the party passed Gilbert, he called Miss Morse aside, saying he wished to speak a word to her.

The girl approached him, and after a few words she wheeled to leave him. It was then the man whipped out a pistol and shot the girl, inflicting wounds which proved fatal twenty-four hours afterward.

Gilbert was captured, placed in jail, after several attempts had been made to do him harm by the enraged persons who lived near by. While in jail, he attempted to commit suicide.

SUICIDE OF A YOUNG WOMAN

Dora Abrams, a strikingly beautiful young woman, 24 years old, was found dead yesterday afternoon in her apartment, in Williamstown, N. Y. Every crack and crevice in the doors and windows of her apartment had been carefully sealed with paper and cloth. This task, he police say, must have required three hours of time. Not a trace was found of any letters, nor is there any other means of ascertaining who her relatives are, and where she came from. The girl's body was found lying in her kitchen. She had dressed herself in her finest clothes, wearing all her jewelry. One end of a hose was tied to her mouth with a silk handkerchief and the other end was fastened to a small gas stove. One of the girl's fingers were three diamond rings, in her ears were diamonds, and she had carefully arranged her hair before lying down to die.

CREWS RESCUED.

The crews of the Lizzie A. Law and Selvin Marvins were yesterday brought off Houghton, Mich., leaving both vessels wrecked on the shores of Lake Superior. The two boats, with their crews of fifteen men, broke away from the steamer Edward Hines last Monday night. Helpless in the gale, the Law went ashore off Kewasaw peninsula, far from any life saving station. One of the sailors tried to reach shore in a yawl, but was capsized and reached the rocks by swimming. He drew with him a line by which the crew all escaped. A woman on board had to dress in man's clothing and she, too, was pulled to safety. The Hines found the crew and later discovered the schooner Marvins. It was necessary to scuttle the Marvins to prevent her from being dashed to pieces. The Law is a wreck.

MAGNESS A DESERTER.

Charles Joseph Magness, husband of the late Senator Gorman's eldest daughter, who was arrested in Louisville, Ky., on a charge of deserting from the U. S. ship Dolphin, is on his way to the League Island navy yard, in custody, where he will be tried on a charge of desertion from the navy. His wife is thought to be accompanying him. He is insisting that late Senator Gorman will assist in getting him out of his trouble. Magness lived high while in Louisville.

Miss Georganna Kappier, a seamstress, of Baltimore, says that she was to have been married on September 22 last to Magness the husband of Miss Gorman and she says that her family may take some action in a breach-of-promise case. Mrs. Magness, at Louisville, yesterday announced that she would stand by her husband.

Miss Kappier has in her possession a number of love letters from Magness written to her in which he called her "sweetheart."

BRANDENBURG ARRESTED.

Broughton Brandenburg, magazine writer and correspondent, who sold to a New York newspaper the article in which the late ex-President Cleveland was quoted as favoring the election of Taft as against Bryan, was taken into custody in Dayton, Ohio yesterday afternoon by the police, at the instance of Chief of Detectives James S. McQuinn, of New York city, on a charge of larceny in the second degree.

Brandenburg, who went to Dayton several days ago, was in the act of boarding an eastbound train when taken into custody by the police. He said he was guilty of no crime.

A photographer, whom he has been unable to locate, knows, he says, in part the conversation that took place between him and Mr. Cleveland on the subject. He said he will return to New York without extradition process ags.
