FALLING OFF IN RECEIPTS.

The losses incident to the prohibition wave are causing deficits to pile up so rapidly at the Treasury Department that a serious deficit is being created in the government resources, and Congress, it is said, will have to take up the matter at the coming session and cover the loss from some other source. It is said that indications point to a deficit of \$2,000,000 for October, and more will follow as the prohibition movement spreads.

The loss in revenues last month, Treasury figures show, on spirituous liquors alone, was \$1,506,819. The total since July has been \$5,542,958, and figures so far received for October show that the loss will be \$2,000,000 or more. The loss on beer and other fermented liquors in September amounted to \$1,796,914.27, and this loss is also increasing.

There are some other curious correlated losses given in the Treasury figures. For instance, thousands of men must have quit playing cards, because the government revenue loss on playing cards was \$9,827.70. As the tax on cards is only 5 cents a pack, the figures show that about 25,000 fewer packs have been purchased.

Also, there is a loss of \$46,886.90 on oleo margarine, \$7,280 on adulterated butter, and 9,664.07 on "renovated" butter, used in free lunch. The loss of cigar taxes totals \$619,194.92.

COMET VISIBLE.

M. Camille Flammarion, the astronomer, announces that persons with good sight can now see the Morehouse comet with the naked eye if they know exactly where to look for it. Its position is between the constellations of the Swan and the Lyre.

The nucleus of the comet has more than 36 times the diameter of the earth, and the tail extending for 43,000,000 kilometers. It is traveling at the rate of 150,000 kilometers (93,000 miles) an hour. The nucleus looks like an agglomeration of small stones merged in an ocean of gas. The tail is formed of dust and gas. This wandering life of comets traveling through space and cutting through the orbit of planets in every direction is not without peril. More than one has met with destruction, and such is probably the final destiny of all comets. There is no fear, however, of this comet coming into collision with our planet. It is more than 93,000,000 miles from the earth, and is now beginning to increase that distance. It will be in perihelion December 25, and will pass round the sun at a distance of 141,000,000 kilometers. It will then speed away into the depths of infinite night.
