

DOUBLE KILLING.

A fight over a woman caused the murder of Floyd Lusk, deputy sheriff of Wyoming, W. Va., and the death of Ira Boyd yesterday. The officer was shot down while attempting to serve a warrant on Boyd. Luke Milam who accompanied the officers, then killed Boyd in a rapid exchange of shots.

The original trouble was between Boyd and Milam. The men were rivals for the hand of a young woman of Wyoming, W. V., and as she did not decide the question for them, though it is generally reported that she favored Boyd, they undertook to settle the matter for themselves. A fight resulted and Milam, who is smaller than his rival, was worsted in the encounter.

Thirsting for revenge Milam secured a warrant for Boyd's arrest and Deputy Lusk was instructed to serve the paper. In the meantime Boyd had heard of the threatened retaliatory measures, and going home armed himself. It is supposed that he considered his attack upon Milam as much more serious than it really was and for that reason dreaded the result of a trial.

Milam and Lusk approached Boyd's home and called upon him to submit to arrest. Boyd's reply is said to have been a discharge fired at Lusk. The officer drew his revolver, but did not shoot. Again Boyd fired and Lusk sank to the ground, dying.

Then without attempting to harm Milam, Boyd ran from the house and started for the woods. Milam, was unarmed but he seized the revolver from the expiring Lusk and fired at his rival. The bullet flew wild, and Boyd, turning in his tracks, returned the shot. Milam was untouched and continued firing rapidly at Boyd. An instant later the murderer was seen to reel, and as he fell he discharged his revolver for the last time, firing into the air. Boyd was dead when Milam reached him.

Milam at once reported the double killing to the authorities, and submitted to being placed under arrest.

MORE SHOCKS.

There was a strong earthquake at dawn yesterday at Caligaron, in the southeastern part of Sicily, followed by a rumbling noise. Many houses collapsed, including a school, which, in falling, brought down a church, burying the sexton and his son. There were also considerable landslides and fissures appearing in the earth.

The inhabitants, numbering 30,000, are terrified and refuse to reenter the houses, from which they fled at the first shock. They are camping in the open country.

Other slighter shocks were felt at Fano and Pesaro and also in the Messina and Reggio area, awakening fresh alarm among the survivors. Two slight shocks were felt at Palmi, where several tiring buildings collapsed. There was a considerable panic, which subsided when the shocks were not repeated.

A correspondent who has just returned to Naples from Messina says it is a heap of ruins and a city of the dead. Nothing can be done with it but burn its corpses and obliterate its ruins.

Dead bodies lie in the streets, and occasional heaps of them remain where they have been gathered by the rescue parties. The work of rescue is now practically abandoned, as it is dangerous and useless. The authorities are refusing to allow anybody to enter Messina, which as soon as possible, will be covered with quick lime.

FLORAL FLAG FOR TAFT.

In addition to "possum and taters," the banquet to be tendered Judge Taft by the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce will have other sparkling features. The banquet room will be laid out with the tables forming an American flag, the colors done in roses, carnations and violets. This floral flag apparently will hang from the ceiling behind the speaker's table, falling to the floor and crossing the speaker's table in making the field of stars, with the guests' table at right angles to the speaker's table, forming the stripes.

When the toastmaster first rises to speak, what apparently is a solid tank of ferns behind the speaker's table will abruptly rise to the ceiling, drawn by invisible wire, revealing the field of blue flowers and white stars, and creating the flag effect. Electric lights will sparkle throughout this scented mass of color.

The menu of the president-elect will lie in a brass casket. It will be in booklet form, the outer cover bearing a heavy gold plate with Judge Taft's name engraved thereon. The menu will be bound in leather and will bear among other emblems a shield representing the Phoenix of Atlanta.
