### WANTS DIVORCE ANNULLED.

Alleging that her divorce from William Guggenheim, one of seven millionaires brothers that make up the great mining and smelting firm of that name, was illegal and invalid, Mrs. Grace B. Guggenheim-Wahl has brought suit in New York for an absolute divorce. It is a very complicated matter and it took some little time to get it straightened out when the case came up for a hearing before Judge Gerard in the Supreme Court yesterday.

The woman now suing and William Guggenheim were married about eight years ago. Their marital happiness lasted twenty days and then Mrs. Guggenheim went to Chicago and obtained a divorce. She says she did so at the instance of her husband. She asked for \$500 a month alimony, and Guggenheim agreed to do even better by her. He settled \$150,000 on her, the interest on which at five per cent. would amount to more than the allowance she asked.

Soon after the divorce Guggenheim remarried. He has a child by the second marriage. His former wife was married several years ago to a Frenchman named Wahl. This latter marriage was annulled in the French courts by reason of the fact that the Frenchman was very young, and that the couple did not give their right names when married.

Now Mrs. Guggenheim-Wahl seeks an absolute divorce because she says she never was a resident of Illinois and had no right to bring suit in that State. She declares in her complaint that she lived in Chicago for a total of six days, consumed in three trips there of two days each in order to obtain her divorce. In applying for this new divorce Mrs. Guggenheim-Wahl asks for counsel fees and alimony pending the suit.

Mr. Guggenheim, who is about 40 years of age, has given large amounts to charities. In October, 1902 he gave \$300,000 to the United Hebrew Charities as a memorial to his mother.

A NEW STORY ABOUT GEN. LEE. A hitherto unpublished story about General Robert E. Lee is given in the Manufacturers' Record of January 14th in an article entitled "Rounding Out of the Nation's Life Through Southern Development," in the course of which it is said:

"At the close of the civil war several young men who had served in the southern army, so the Manufacturers' Record has recently been told by one who was in the party, called on Gen. Robert E. Lee. In explaining the object of their visit, they said to him:

"Your name has carried us into many places where we did not want to go. Now we want to take your name with us where we are going, and we have come to ask for your autograph on these photographs."

"General Lee, in reply, said: 'If my name has carried you, as you say, into places into which you did not want to go, I want you to be careful not to carry it into any place where I would not want it to go. Where are you going?'

"One said that he was bound for Mexico, another that he was looking to the far Southwest, and the others to distant sections because they felt there was no opportunity for them at home by reason of the destruction caused by the war.

"General Lee said to them: 'As soldiers you served your state faithfully; you did your duty; you risked your lives in the service of your country; but your state needs you today more than it needed you in war. It has hard problems to settle. Its business interests have been destroyed, and for these very reasons it seems to me your state has a right to ask you to stand by it in these days of trial and to help to rebuild its fortunes. Consider whether you do not owe to your state, under these conditions, the same devotion to it that you gave to it at the call of war.'

"If it had been possible for this thought of the great Confederate soldier to have been carried out, and if the hundreds of thousands of young, virile men who left this section within a few years after the war, and the two and a half million people who have left it during the past forty years had been able to find at home scope for their energy, employment for their talents, whether of brain or muscle, what a mighty difference there would have been, not only in the south, but in other sections! The south would have gained the energy of these people and the energy of the children born to them, while other sections, which have been enriched by their work, would to that extent have made less relative progress than they have made."
