MATCH FLASHERS GASOLINE. Charles Oakerson, employed as a tinsmith by H. N. Moore, was crossing the sidewalk on Main street, New Egypt, N. J., with a bucket of gasoline Saturday when a bystander, for a joke, threw a lighted match into the bucket, thinking it was water. There was a flash and in an instant the entire front of the row of business places occupied by H. N. Moore, G. R. ret South, W. S. Chafey and others was flaming. For a moment the people were gasp-stricken, but the screams of 6-year-old Mabel South, who was caught in the blaze, soon brought them to their senses and Edward Grover, William Thompson and Robert A. Abbott sprang in and snatched the little girl from the flames. Thompson and Grover tore the burning garments off while Abbott wrapped her in his coat and ran to the nearest physician's office. Abbott and Thompson were badly burned and it is feared the child will die. She is the daughter of Ridgeway South. The fire company extinguished the flames before serious damage was done to the buildings and the total loss will be about \$800.

CATHOLICS IN THE UNITED STATES. There are 14,285,451 Roman Catholics in the United States, according to advance sheets of the 1909 "Willis Catholic Directory."
