KILLED BY STORMS.

What appears to have been two or more terrific tonades swept over western Alabama yesterday, killing between ten and twenty people and doing half a million dollars damage to property. The storms came from the west. Booth, Miss., was struck early in the day and six persons lost their lives there, and the town was demolished. At Montgomery, much damage was done, and it is reported that several people lost their lives in the country near there. Reports received last night in Birmingham state that Cullman, Ala., was demolished and several people killed.

Death for probably a score of persons, losses of hundreds of thousands of dollars in property and the crippling of many telegraph wires resulted between noon and dusk yesterday from a series of small tornadoes which swept the south central states from the Tennessee line to the Texas peninsula. The storms were accompanied in most cases by hail, darkness, terrific lightning flashes, and sheets of rain.

Dispatches from points in Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana and Texas report tornadoes, hail, rain, thunder and lightning, loss of life and damage to property. Five hundred cattle were drowned by the flood waters on the Sanford ranch, near Tehama, California, Wednesday night, and 1,500 sheep perished near Colusa. It is estimated that the damage in Colusa county will be about \$1,000,000. The loss in Butte county is estimated at \$60,000, and in Glenn, Tehama, Sutter, and Yuba counties approximately \$250,000.

MORE ASSAULTS.

Bianche Smith and Rose Seacock, residing in a suburb of Pittsburg, Pa., were attacked by negroes yesterday, but their screams frightened the assailants, who escaped. Two negroes accused of being those who attacked the girls were later arrested and sent to the workhouse for three months. John Stokes, a negro, aged 32 years, was arrested in Pittsburg, yesterday, on charges preferred by Mrs. Jane Thompson, who alleges that he entered her home and the room of her daughter, but was frightened away by the screams of the girl.

Mrs. Mary Kruse, aged 80 years, was attacked at her home, near Johnstown, Pa., yesterday, by a negro. The aged woman's screams frightened her assailant, who escaped, leaving his victim in a critical condition. Shortly after the assault a negro giving the name of Arthur Cochran, and said to be the one who committed the crime, was arrested and is being closely guarded, as the neighbors of Mrs. Kruse threaten to do the prisoner bodily harm.

Mrs. Anna Davis, of Lyon Station, near Uniontown, Pa., shot and fatally wounded James Dorahue, yesterday, when he, another white man and three negroes attempted to force an entrance into her home. The men laughed at the woman when she warned them to leave, and seizing her husband's revolver, she fired through the door.

GOD IN THE CONSTITUTION.

Senator Richardson, of Delaware, by request, introduced a joint resolution yesterday proposing an amendment to the Constitution acknowledging the Deity in this foundation document of the government.

The resolution is as follows: "Whereas it is acknowledged by the Deity is reasonably desired by many citizens of this country and is in the interest of the highest and vital truth, morality and fitness; therefore be it, "Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-thirds of each house concurring therein) that the following prefix be proposed to the legislatures of the several states as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States as part of the Constitution namely: "The preamble to the Constitution shall begin with the words and sentence: "In the name of God."

Like all of its predecessors, the resolution will never be heard of again. For the last 20 years there is every year made an effort to "put God into the Constitution," but the Congress will never act.
