SCHOONER SEIZED.
 A dispatch from Vancouver, B. C., says the Dominion government cruiser Kestrel arrived in port yesterday, having in charge the American halibut fishing schooner Charles Levi Woodbury, which she captured after firing four rounds from her machine guns and threatening to sink the alleged poaching vessel unless she surrendered. The action took place Sunday afternoon in northern waters alleged to be contiguous to Canada.

Five shots tore through the air in the direction of the Woodbury. Each time the machine gun was fired as the vessels traded at full speed from the west coast of Vancouver island into the Pacific. The first round was merely to call attention to the command to heave to which had been issued to the American schooner, but the others meant business.

The gun was pointed at the fishboat, which was then at a distance of about 200 yards and making for the open sea as rapidly as possible. The shots, which were aimed high, ripped the mainmast of the schooner, and one or two knocked splinters off the main mast. At the same moment, the second gun of the Kestrel was swung across her deck to get into range. The Woodbury then heave to and her sails, gashed by the British missiles, were hauled down.

Even then the American captain would not willingly surrender. He declined to make fast a hawser to his vessel, but a few minutes later an officer and three men from the Kestrel boarded the Woodbury and took charge. The seizure of the schooner will have a tendency to hasten the reaching of a definite understanding between the American and British governments as to their attitude toward Hecla strait, which the Canadians desire shall be regarded a "closed sea" and the right of fishing therein denied to Americans.

The United States takes the position that Hecla strait is an open sea. The strait lies between the mainland of British Columbia and Queen Charlotte island, and is 28 miles wide at its narrowest point.

STRUCK BY A STREET CAR.
 Mrs. Sarah E. Thompson, said to be the only woman carried on the pension rolls as a soldier of the United States, and who was instrumental in the capture, near the close of the war, of the Confederate general, John T. Morgan, lies in a critical condition at Chesapeake Hospital, Washington. About 8:50 o'clock yesterday morning she was crushed beneath the wheels of a Capital Traction Company car near First and B streets southeast. It is thought that Mrs. Thompson was endeavoring to board a westbound car when she became confused, got in the way of another car and was run over. She sustained a serious and probably fatal fracture of the skull and several lacerations about the head. Mrs. Thompson, who is 71 years old, is employed in the office of the sixth auditor of the Postoffice Department.
