Two men were mortally hurt and a third badly cut up by a wildly dashing red taxicab at Seventh and Twenty-third streets, New York, yesterday. The machine, crowded with women, put on an extra burst of speed, and dashed away, though three policemen tried to stop it. Mrs. Gordon Hoyt, aged 40, and daughter, Clara, aged 14, were drowned yesterday at Soap Harbor, Lake Keuka, N. Y. Miss Hoyt had gone in bathing, and was seized with cramps. She was seen by her mother, who at once hurried to her rescue. In the girl's struggle she dragged down her mother and both were drowned. Cruisers are today patrolling the anchorage place of the Russian Imperial yacht, Standart, on which the czar and carina, their children, and entourage will come to Oberburg Saturday, to prevent the anarchists from planting a mine to destroy the yacht. The city is plastered with posters urging a demonstration against the "Red Orar."
