Many deplorable instances of forced marriages are there in California and the other Pacific coast states. Take the Helen Emery and "Aoki" case; a great deal has been said about it, much has been published in regard to the circumstances surrounding the early stages of the acquaintance of the Emery family with this Japanese raider upon the innocence of American purity, but nothing was attempted and nothing was done to stamp out the perniciousness of the act; but, on the other hand, the matter was passed by as an incident of the present condition of life in California, and with it a whole family prominent in the best circles of our best people have passed out of our home life and forced to live exiled from friends and relatives. Hundreds of other cases we never hear of, and this is only the beginning of the end, unless pure white Americans can be aroused to stamp an iron heel upon the invader, and cry unto him—"Back, back to your own shores!"

THE NEW CLERMONT.

With plain cordwood as fuel the wall-sided, scow-shaped stovepipe funneled craft in which Robert Fulton first navigated the waters of the Hudson river under steam propulsion 102 years ago came to life again yesterday. The reconstructed Clermont, built for the Hudson-Fulton celebration, had her official speed trial from Martine's Harbor, Staten Island, to Robin's Reef light in the lower bay. The distance traveled was 6 miles, and the elapsed time was 1 hour 4 minutes.

This means that if historical accuracy is to be preserved, the skipper of today's Clermont will have to reduce the inordinate speed of his vessel by nearly 1 mile an hour, for the Clermont of 1807 made only 5 miles an hour. Aside from the Clermont's excess speed the trial was successful both from a nautical and spectacular point of view. From both banks of the Kill von Kull hundreds watched the rippling progress of the craft.

The navigator was Capt. Ulster Davis, who will impersonate Capt. James Winans, the skipper of the original Clermont, during the forthcoming celebration.

BRIDE POISONED.

G. E. Sayre, a merchant of Backett, a little town in Ritchie county, W. Va., was arrested yesterday and placed in jail at Harrisville, on the charge of the murder of his 17-year-old bride, whose death occurred in St. Joseph's Hospital in Parkersburg last Tuesday morning.

About three weeks ago Sayre and Miss Blanche Wright, daughter of a Baptist preacher at Lawford, Ritchie county, eloped to Parkersburg and were married. On the day of their marriage, the bride became seriously ill from the effects of a tablet of bichloride of mercury, which was administered to her, it is alleged, by her husband, who thought that it was an antiseptic tablet. Two weeks later the bride, after horrible sufferings from the deadly poison, passed away in the hospital.

Yesterday Sayre was arrested just as he was about to leave Ritchie county, it is claimed, as he had drawn all of his money from the bank and had sold his store. A warrant charging Sayre with first degree murder was issued yesterday afternoon.

SHARK RENDS DEVILFISH.

A furious battle between a big devilfish and a shark is the talk of Fort de Soto, Fla. Captain John V. Bodden was standing on the quartermaster's dock when he noticed an empty yawl boat being drawn down at its mooring by some unseen force until it was submerged. Then the tentacle of a devilfish, estimated to have measured fully 15 feet and weighing a ton and a half, protruded from the water. The great fish became entangled in the moorings of the yawl and was unable to disengage itself. At this juncture a 15 foot shark attacked the devilfish, tearing its great tentacles to pieces and seizing the remains of the devilfish, carried both them and the boat away at high speed.
