### ROBBER COMMITS SUICIDE.

A fashionably dressed bandit, early yesterday afternoon robbed the savings bank of D. M. Eskine & Co., in Highland Park, Ill., 25 miles north of Chicago, and later committed suicide by shooting himself in the mouth when driven at bay by a marshal and a posse of citizens. A companion of the robber who had driven him to the bank in an automobile, was captured immediately following the robbery, forcing the principal perpetrator of the daring daylight crime to flee on foot. He was engaged in a running duel with Marshal John Sheehan, who was the target for many bullets from the fugitive bandit's revolver, one of which went through the sleeve of his coat. After running several blocks and failing to drive back his pursuers, the robber ran into a shed, closely followed by Sheehan. When he saw Sheehan enter the shed with his revolver leveled at his head the fugitive put the muzzle of his own revolver in his mouth and fired a shot which resulted in his death almost immediately.

Neither he nor his companion is known. The robbery was conducted in a deliberate and spectacular manner, the bandit securing about \$500 in gold coin and bills after he had forced John C. Duffy, cashier of the bank; Miss Nellie Fitzgerald, the bookkeeper, and Joseph F. Richards, the receiving teller, into the cashier's cage just after the closing of business for the day.

### EXCITEMENT IN PARIS.

Ten thousand men, headed by M. Jaures, leader of the socialists in the Chamber of Deputies, and M. Vaillant, a socialist deputy, last night marched to the Spanish embassy in Paris to hold a demonstration in protest against the execution of Prof. Ferrer, which took place at Barcelona yesterday. The police surrounded the building, however, and repelled the surging crowds.

A policeman was killed by a shot intended for Prefect of Police Leprieux which passed so close to him that his face was marked by powder.

A mass meeting was summoned by special editions of Deputy Jaures' newspaper, Humanite, and Here's organ, the Social War, published yesterday afternoon calling on every one to meet in the Place de Clignancourt on the Boulevard de Courcelles at 9:30. Here's appeal was worded with more than his customary violence. He said: "The royal young idiot whose heart has not been touched by Ferrer's daughter's tears, or the indignant protests of the civilized world, is an assassin. He will end like his neighbor, Portugal's royal hog. He signed his own condemnation to death this morning, and when he dies like a dog no man of heart in the whole world will shed a tear over the royal curion."

### VICTIM OF OPERATION.

Dr. Simpson, of Fiverton, R. I., announces that the girl whose body has been found piece-meal near the Bulgermarsh road undoubtedly met her death through a criminal operation. He conducted an autopsy yesterday afternoon and determined that the victim was not over 17 years old.

From the fitness of the fish and general condition of the body, as far as could be told, it is believed that she is a girl of good family, carefully reared and well kept. Yesterday afternoon the arms and missing foot were discovered, so that the only part of the body not yet assembled is the head.

The doctor who examined the torso said that the heart was entirely devoid of blood, which might indicate that the young woman did not die a natural death. The portions of the body found yesterday were rolled in copies of a Boston newspaper of September 28, 1909. They lay by the side of a stone wall parallel with the Bulgermarsh road. It appeared that the person who hid them had walked up the path and thrown them over the wall.

### SIX MEN DROWNED.

In the wreck of the steamer George Stone, of Cleveland, Ohio, on Point Pelee, Ontario, yesterday, six lives were lost.

The six victims lost their lives when Capt. Paul Howell, Peter Daley, and six members of the crew were capsized in the surf attempting to go ashore for assistance. Two of the crew clung to the overturned boat four hours until they drifted ashore. The remaining ten members of the crew were taken off the wreck about noon by a steamer.

It was about 2:30 a. m. when the Stone struck nearly 5 miles off the western shore of Point Pelee. Until daybreak the crew remained on the forward cabin and pilot-house. Fire added to the dangers at this point, the pilot-house being burned to the deck before the blaze was subdued by the waves and spray.

Toward 9 o'clock the steel lifeboat was launched. It was capsize by a comb and six of the occupants drowned.
