DUKE FIGHTS FOR HIS WIFE.

The troubled romance of Duke Marc de la Lallo-Rochemaure and of his wife, a beautiful "Maid of Athens," seems to be about to end happily. The interesting details might have remained unknown but that the young duke's father brought suit in the civil court at Erenoble to annul his son's marriage.

The exciting vicissitudes of this love-match began in 1905, when the young duke married Marika Karousos, a lovely girl, daughter of an honorable family, poor, but commanding the respect of the community.

The duke's father was a friend of Pope Leo XIII, who bestowed on him his title.

The oldest son, Marc, gave no proofs of early piety. Instead, he sowed his wild oats so freely that his father sent him abroad with a tutor. At Athens he met, loved and married Marika Karousos, before his tutor discovered and reported the affair.

Then at the command of the father, the tutor kidnaped the young man, put him on a steamer and went to Vienna with him. But the heroic blood of all the Greeks was inflamed in the veins of Marika Karousos. She followed to Vienna, met Duke Marc at a place he had named to her by secret correspondence and they fled back to Athens before the old duke could intervene. Duke Marc gave a great bridal banquet, and he and his bride enjoyed their honeymoon until he spent all his money.

The bridegroom wrote to his father, who answered, sternly, "Return home or be disinherited." Sadly the young duke obeyed. His father appealed to Rome to have the marriage annulled.

But he failed to reckon with the indomitable Grecian spirit of his son's wife. She went to Rome, was admitted to the pope, and told him truthfully that her baby boy had been baptized, not in the Greek, but in the Roman Catholic Church. His Holiness, impressed by her purity and devotion, refused to annul her marriage.

Infuriated the father began the suit in the French Civil Courts which is going on at Grenoble. Soon the Vatican excommunicated him for not abiding by its decision. The suit for annulment of the marriage is being fought bitterly. The elder duke's lawyers have insisted that Marika's past is not without its shadow. The court interrupted the proceedings long enough to permit her to deny the accusations indignantly.

DESTROYERS BY SOUND.

A wonderful torpedo which picks up sound and tracks it down is reported to be in the hands of the British Admiralty, by which it will be subjected very soon to exhaustive trials. The principle of the microphone is utilized.

The "torpedo with a brain," as the new weapon has been dubbed, is fitted with a delicate mechanism which is controlled by a microphone attached to the torpedo's rudders. When the microphone picks up a sound it deflects the rudders in such a manner as to guide the torpedo straight to the source of the sound wave.

Properly aimed, the inventors claim that the torpedo will pick up unerringly the noise made by the propellers of an enemy's vessel. Further than this, it is claimed that the mechanism is such that it can be so adjusted that the torpedo will strike not at the immediate origin of the sound, but thirty or forty yards to the right or left of the propellers at the will of the manipulator. This feature, if proved, would make it possible to place the torpedo in the vital part of a ship that was steaming across the new weapon's track.

FEAT OF AN AERONAUT.

Working quietly away from the scenes of public controversies and with the eyes of aeronauts busy in other fields, Wallace E. Tillinghast, vice president of the Suez Canal Manufacturing Company, of Worcester, Mass., has invented, built and tested what he says is an aeroplane capable of carrying three passengers with a weight limit of 200 pounds each a distance of at least 300 miles without a stop to replenish the supply of petrol and if necessary at a rate of 120 miles an hour. Mr. Tillinghast states that he has gone in his aeroplane to the Statue of Liberty, near New York city, then to Boston and back to the starting point without alighting. Another part of this trip is still more wonderful. Mr. Tillinghast says that when near Fire Island one of the cylinders of the flyer ran irregularly, so the motor was stopped, with the machine 4,000 feet in the air, and sailed 46 minutes while two mechanics repaired it in mid-air, the engine being started again when the aeroplane was near enough to land to be seen by a member of the life-saving crew patrolling the beach.

MORE TROUBLE CONCERNING THE CASIPELLANE BOYS.

Count Bonide Ostellane, former husband of the Princess de Sagan, who was Miss Anna Gould, has petitioned the court to compel the countess to select tutors for their three sons who will be acceptable to him as well as to the countess, and to have these tutors make weekly reports to him regarding the children's education. Boni declared to the court that the education of the boys, particularly that of Jay, the youngest, was being neglected, through incompetent instruction and that the countess was not showing the proper interest in the educational welfare of her children. He said the countess was defying the original order of the court.
