### BILLS, BILLS, BILLS.

The following are some of the bills passed by the House or Senate before the legislature adjourned and which have not heretofore been published in the Gazette.

#### SENATE.

To regulate the conduct and equipment of hotels, to provide for the inspection thereof.

To amend an act to protect and advance agriculture by regulating the sale and purity of commercial fertilizers.

To amend an act to regulate the practice of pharmacy and the composition, branding, possession, dispensing and sale of drugs, poison and narcotics.

Providing for detection or commitment of minors under seventeen years of age for certain offenses not in jail or penitentiaries; placing them in suitable homes and institutions under certain circumstances; when they can and cannot be sent to jail; allowing them to be released on probation; appointment of probation officers and curtailing their duties.

To amend the code in reference to marriages within certain degrees prohibited.

To amend an act to empower boards of supervisors to enact special and local legislation to protect the public roads and bridges from obstruction, encroachment and injury, to make violations of such enactments a misdemeanor, and to provide penalties.

To amend an act to authorize school boards to borrow money and to issue bonds for the purpose of erecting and furnishing school houses.

To appropriate \$225 to monument fund of the Immorta. S. x Hundred Confederate Veterans.

To authorize the state board of health to adopt and enforce rules and regulations for the betterment and protection of the public health of the state of Virginia.

To amend the law as to supervisor of poor.

To extend the breeders' line twelve months from the delivery of a live colt, or until the price agreed upon for the season by the owner of the stallion or jockey and the owner of the mare or jockey be paid.

To organize county and city boards of poor commissioners, and requiring reports from said boards.

To repeal sections of the law in reference to certain reports of the superintendent of the poor and auditor of public accounts.

To regulate the sale of agricultural seeds, to provide a standard of purity for such seeds.

To establish a state board of accountancy.

To amend the Code relative to the appointment of coroners.

To amend the Code relative to duties of coroner.

Making it a misdemeanor for parents or guardians to refuse or neglect to support their children under fourteen years of age, or to subject children under seven years of age to vicious or immoral influences; to encourage any child to commit a misdemeanor; or to send a child under seventeen years of age to certain places, punishment thereof and declaring an emergency.

To amend an act concerning public corporations, requiring railroads to post notices of delayed trains, etc.

Providing for the establishment of a kennel for blood hounds at the penitentiary farm and providing how they shall be furnished to the authorities of the various counties.

Making it a misdemeanor for persons to unlawfully use or wear any insignia or badge of any association, or society, or trade's union, or any scutcheon cross of honor.

To authorize cities and towns to permit under certain conditions, swings, fire escapes, and shutters to overhang streets.

To provide for the examination of the books of land assessors by the clerk of court.

To appropriate \$65,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to pay the pensions of soldiers and the widows of soldiers whose pensions have not been paid.

To allow compensation to the "Virginia Home and Industrial School for Girls," for caring for girls committed to its custody and control under a commitment of a court, judge or justice.

To make an appropriation to provide for the erection of a tablet to Patrick Henry.

To amend the law in relation to the establishment of the public roads and landings.

To authorize turnpike companies and other corporations owning turnpikes to make changes in the alignment of turnpikes and to validly change heretofore made.

To require the state board of agriculture to provide for the manufacture and distribution of serum for the prevention and treatment of hog cholera.

To provide help for destitute persons bitten by mad dogs.

Providing funds to help maintain insane consumptives at the Catawba Sanatorium.

To amend the code in reference to injury to hired horse or vehicle by reckless riding, driving, etc.

To amend the code in relation to liens on crops for advance to farmers.

To amend the code in relation to fighting cocks, dogs, etc.

Providing for the registration of pharmacists who own and operate drug stores and pharmacies in towns and cities of Virginia which are divided and separated from other towns or cities in adjoining states by the state line, and who are residents of Virginia, and lawfully registered as pharmacists, and who own and operate drug stores or pharmacies in the adjoining towns or cities of such adjoining states.

To provide for the continuance of the commission to devise a stable method for the maintenance, management and expansion of the educational institutions of the state.

To amend the code in relation to lists of property, and so forth, delinquent for taxes.

To amend the law in regard to the sinking fund.

To amend the law as to the returns to be made by banks for purposes of taxation.

To prescribe certain regulations for those desiring to enter upon the practice of medicine.

To fix the law in regard to assessment for municipal improvements.

To provide how the brokerage tax shall be paid.

To amend the law as to weights and measures.

To fix the law in regard to changes in charters.

To fix the law as to lists of deeds to be made by certain officers.

To amend the law as to the duties of boards of supervisors; the governor's bill to provide a United Agricultural Board; to provide for the payment of poll tax in certain cases the bill allowing judges to grant bail in certain cases of appeal; to amend the law as to the board of agriculture and immigration; to extend the time of local land assessors; making it a misdemeanor for parents or guardians to refuse or neglect to support their children under fourteen years of age, or to subject children under seven years of age to vicious or immoral influences; to require the reporting of cases of infectious, contagious communicable and dangerous disease to boards of health; to amend an act to establish a permanent place in the State penitentiary, at Richmond, for the execution of felons upon whom the death penalty is to be imposed, and to change the mode of execution so that the death sentence shall be by electricity.

To amend an act to provide for authorizing county or city school boards to sell or exchange public school property, extending the same provisions to district school board; to declare any person of one sixteenth of negro blood a negro, and every person of a colored person having one-quarter or more of Indian blood an Indian; to prohibit the use of opium in the manufacture of cigarettes; to amend the code in regard to how a minister is authorized to celebrate the rite of marriage; to authorize and empower the State Corporation Commission to close or discontinue any private dock or wharf affected with a public use or easement in certain cases; regarding location of the criminal insane.

The Senate concurred in the bill to regulate the sale of conditional stock foods.

Concurrence was voted on the Fletcher bill providing an extension of time for returns by local land assessors, amenable to the tax commission.

#### HOUSE.


The House agreed to the Senate amendments to the bill providing for the manufacture and sale of hog cholera serum.

The House passed the following Senate bills. Permitting judges, boards of supervisors and town and city councils to prescribe rules regarding the government of jails and reduction of sentences of prisoners; the bill allowing incorporated country clubs to sell and dispense liquor to their members and guests; providing for examination and testing of dairy cattle for controlling tuberculosis; slightly increasing the pay of clerks of district school boards.

The House agreed to an amendment to the bill prescribing the composition of members of electoral board. The change made was in eliminating the payment of mileage. The bill was passed.

The bill making the drawing of a check when funds to cover are not in the bank prima facie evidence of larceny was passed.

The governor's bill, alias the coordination bill, came from the Senate with an amendment cutting out the appropri-

for the first year and allowing \$15,000 the second year. It was finally passed.

The House then passed the following Senate bills: Allowing notice to be served on the attorney for a non-resident; three companion bills amending the laws regarding the custody of insane persons and the disposition of such persons when charged with crime, allowing cities to spend money for harbor improvements within two miles of their corporate limits; forbidding the establishment of cemeteries within 400 yards of dry wells; fixing the license taxes on circuses and side shows; requiring railroad companies to pay taxes by November 1 instead of December 1; providing for the better assessment of property taxes on voters who become of age between February 1 and the day of election; providing the time when license taxes shall be paid to the state treasury; amending the law with reference to the listing of property for taxation; providing a method of assessment for telegraph and telephone companies; collecting the taxes of telegraph and telephone companies; taxing billiard parlors; with special reference to watering places; requiring railroads to provide suitable criss-cross cars on freight trains; extending to city schools the provisions of the law referring to devices.

Allowing government clerks to serve as members of town councils. Everybody voted at the call of every name; prorating the pension fund in case there is not sufficient money with which to pay all demands.

The following bills were passed:

Providing for the payment to the sinking fund of any balance of the direct tax fund from the United States government.

Amending the law governing deeds for delinquent lands.

Providing for the recordation of copies of papers in bankruptcy proceedings when titles will be affected.

Requiring accommodations for passengers at waiting places.

Providing for apportioning school funds and taking the census of children in school districts which are situated in more than one county.

Allowing interrogatories to be served on nonresident defendants.


