Carter, president of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Fire and Engine, announced in Chicago that a strike of 25,000 firemen on practically all the Western railroads had been decided upon. The strike was authorized by a recent vote of more than 80 per cent of the Brotherhood on the lines involved. The railroads late last night issued a statement that to prevent a strike they would, if necessary, appeal to the Federal authorities at Washington. The controversy which has been under discussion for more than six weeks involves 47 railroads. It has previously been stated by both sides that if a strike were called it would tie up every freight and passenger train between Chicago and the Pacific coast.
