CENSUS TAKING.

The explicit and legibly printed instructions to the census enumerators, which have been prepared by the United States census bureau, give a clear idea of the character of the answers expected from the people of the United States with regard to the questions in the population schedule to be carried in the decennial census April 15 next.

All answers are to have reference solely to the "Census Day," which is April 15. Persons living on that day, but who died after it and before the enumerators call are to be counted, but persons born after April 15 are not to be included in the count. Persons who were single on April 15 are to be reported as single, even though they have married subsequently and before the canvasser has called. This is true, similarly, of persons who became widowed or divorced after April 15.

The census law provides that all persons shall be enumerated at their "usual place of abode" on April 15. This means the place where they may be said to live or belong or the place which is their home. As a rule, the usual place of abode is not the place where a person works or where he eats, but where he regularly sleeps. The enumerators are cautioned, however, that where a man happens to sleep at the time of the enumeration may not be the place where he regularly sleeps.

There will be a number of persons having their usual places of abode in enumeration districts who will be absent April 15. These are to be included and enumerated after the facts regarding them have been obtained from their families, relatives, acquaintances, or other person able to give the information. For instance, if a member of any family in an enumeration district is temporarily away from home on a visit or on business, or traveling for pleasure or attending school or college, or sick in a hospital, such absent person is to be enumerated and included with the family at home.

Servants, laborers or other employees who live with the family and sleep in the same house or on the premises, should be enumerated with the family. The census bureau states that there will be, on the other hand, a certain number of persons present and perhaps lodging and sleeping in districts at the time of the enumeration who do not have their usual places of abode. It must be assumed that they will be enumerated elsewhere. The canvassers should not therefore, unless it is practically certain that they will not be enumerated anywhere else, enumerate or include with the members of a family they are enumerating any of the following classes:

Persons visiting a family: Transient boarders or lodgers who have some other usual or permanent place of abode;

Students or children living or boarding with a family in order to attend some school, college or other educational institution in the locality but not regarding the place as their home;

Persons who take their meals with a family, but lodge or sleep elsewhere;

Servants, apprentices, or other persons employed by a family and working in the house or on the premises, but not sleeping there; or

Any person who was formerly in a family but who has since become a permanent inmate of an asylum, almshouse, home for the aged, reformatory, prison, or any other institution in which the inmates may remain for long period of time.

DENONCED MINISTERS' MEETING.

Resolutions which, had there been present a sufficient number of Richmond ministers to have voted on their passing, would have very likely precipitated a local option campaign were tabled yesterday morning when just 17 of the Richmond clergy met at a ministers' meeting. The meeting was begun with a near sensation, when Rev. Dr. R. W. Ordilin, white of beard and decrepit with age, but with the fire of indignation showing in his eye, denounced the meeting and shocked the assembled ministers by the following statement:

"O, my brothers, I am sorry I came to this meeting. I came here hoping that I would be helped by the experience of mingling with men filled with the grace of God. I came hoping to find love and Christian forbearance, and instead I find bedlam. I am ashamed of you, my brothers, and I don't think I will come to another meeting."

Two of the ministers present—Rev. B. F. Lipscomb and Rev. W. Asbury Christian—pre-acted against the statement of the aged clergyman, stating that the ministers were not lacking in courtesy or feeling for each other, but Rev. Dr. Ordilin left shortly after, declaring he had not intended his remarks as personal ones.

The ministerial union received the report of the special committee of five named one week ago to make some recommendations as to what course the ministers of the city should pursue looking to the calling of a local option election in Richmond. Only seventeen of more than one hundred ministers attended. The report was referred to a future meeting of the union. The report was that a campaign of education should begin forthwith.

RAIN, SNOW AND SLEET.
A terrific rain, snow and sleet storm, accompanied by high winds, was raging throughout eastern Colorado and western Nebraska last night. It has cut off Denver from wire communication from the east, and has cost much delay to transportation.

According to meagre reports received by telegraph companies, trains traversing that territory are stalled in snow-drifts. Telegraph companies last night report that there is not a wire into Denver from the east, the last one, which was routed by way of St. Paul, Helena, and Salt Lake falling last night. In many places miles of poles have been carried down and the wires lie tangled in a mass which, it is said, cannot be cleared away for several days.

Wire communication with the Pacific coast also has suffered materially from the storm, and what few wires are working are over circuitous and unusual routes.

At Limon, Colo., the snow is 5 feet deep, blocking traffic on the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad. The wind is blowing the snow into immense drifts. The railway station at Genoa, Colo., was blown away, but no one was hurt. Forty miles of telegraph poles were blown down between Fort Morgan and Wray, Colo.

The Kansas division of the Union Pacific Railroad is blocked east and west of Limon.

North Dakota experienced an old-fashioned blizzard, the wind piling up the snow in drifts.
