MAY DAY STRIKES.
The 6,000 makers already on strike in New York turned their attention to the delivery service yesterday in the hope of getting the drivers to quit.
Managers of large hotels that run their own bakeries reported today that they had plenty of new men who were giving full satisfaction.
The strike spread to South Brooklyn yesterday though the larger Brooklyn bakers are still unaffected. In New York, the Hebrew bakers also went on strike yesterday when their demands were refused.

Machinists of the Missouri Pacific Railroad, who struck yesterday morning for increases in wages, were ignored yesterday at the railroad's headquarters. About 1,000 men at different shops of the Missouri Pacific and the Iron Mountain systems quit work yesterday. They asked an increase of four cents an hour and improved working conditions. The company had offered them a three cent increase.
All the demands of the 35,000 striking miners of Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma and Arkansas were refused by the executive committee of the Southwestern Coal Operators' Association in Kansas City yesterday. It was announced that all negotiations were at an end and that the strike would continue.

Three thousand freight handlers in a mass-meeting in Chicago Sunday night rejected a wage increase of one cent an hour offered them by the railroad and decided to serve an ultimatum on the managers.
St. Louis were in progress yesterday in Watertown, Hartford, Meriden and Middletown, Conn., in the building and allied trades for increase in wages. At Watertown about 250 hosiery makers and a number of masses quit, and when three non-union men continued to work a near-riot ensued, which the police soon quelled. Building operation are tied up.

To enforce demands for more wages or shorter working hours 5,000 men, mostly in the building trades were on a strike in New England last night. In central and western Massachusetts, 4,200 men employed on the trolley lines are only awaiting the sanction of their union to go out.
Hundreds of farmers within a radius of 100 miles of Boston are striking for higher summer prices for milk and are trying to emphasize their demands by holding back from the Boston market their milk product.

Practically all the union plumbers in Worcester, Mass., struck yesterday because of the refusal of the master plumbers to grant the men every Saturday afternoon off during the year without loss of pay. A strike of the union carpenters to enforce a demand for an increase in wages from the present scale of \$3.28 to \$3.50 a day was also declared.
Six hundred carpenters, lathers and electricians, who struck at Fall River, Mass., yesterday for higher wages and shorter hours, tied up construction work in Fall River.

Three hundred and fifty union carpenters went on strike in Cincinnati yesterday for an increase in wages of from 40 to 50 cents an hour.
Two Mayday strikes were inaugurated in Rochester, N. Y., yesterday morning when interior woodworkers and lathers went out. The woodworkers demand an 8-hour day and a minimum wage scale of \$3.50. The lathers demand an increase in wages.
In a demand for a daily wage of \$3.28, 400 carpenters stopped work in Portland, Me., yesterday. The men have been receiving \$2.75.

Cutting his way through a living mass of 20,000 cheering people, his white locks bare to the breeze and his shuffling feet keeping time to the strains of The Star Spangled Banner, Edward Payson Weston yesterday brought to a triumphant end his ocean walk. He ascended the steps of the City Hall in New York at 3:10 p. m., completing the trans-continental journey of 3,483 miles in 77 walking days, a feat without parallel in the annals of pedestrianism.
They railed stilette was welcomed to his home city by Mayor Gynor, who presented him with a purse of \$400, hurriedly raised by a handful of his admirers in the last hours of his spectacular walk. This and the admiration and applause of the thousands who have followed his tramp since the day of his inception at Los Angeles on February 1st, is all the reward that comes to the intrepid seafarer after his two months and more of tugging through heat and cold across the continent.
In the last stages of his walk to New York he was the object of an ovation.

are which is likely to play an important part in future naval battles. It is described as a new kind of Greek fire, and it is the invention of a German officer. It is poured out on the water and directed against hostile ships. The fluid which occasions this fire, the composition of which is a secret, is of such a kind that it floats on the water and is impossible to extinguish at the flames. It is reported that the experiment, at which the emperor was present, and which took place on the Tegal and White lakes, all kinds of exploding materials were used to destroy this new form of Greek fire, but neither water nor any chemical had the slightest effect.

A WIFE'S ATROCIIOUS CRIME.
An act of atrocious brutality is reported from the village of Neuhessen, in the Westerwald district of Hesse. A baker's wife, wishing to free herself from the encumbrance of her husband, who is somewhat weak of intellect, drenched him with petroleum, and with the assistance of one of the workmen, shut him up in one of the ovens, with the intention of burning him to death. The wretched man's despairing screams fortunately brought rescue to his help before the woman could complete her infamous scheme.

EMMETT A. O'NEAL, of Florence, and **E. P. THOMAS**, of Eufaula, were nominated in a primary election yesterday by the democrats of Alabama to be governor and lieutenant governor, respectively, of the state. O'Neal made the race on the local option platform. He was one of the most active opponents to the statewide prohibition amendment in the recent campaign. Senator Bankhead was nominated for the U. S. Senate.

AT BARROW-IN-FURNESS yesterday the keel was laid of the battleship Princess Royal, the largest warship of any navy in the world. She will be of 26,000 tons displacement and 700 feet long.
No decision of the U. S. Supreme Court was announced yesterday in the copyright case. The court took recess until May 16. The only other day the court will be in session this term will be May 31.
