A Bee That Digs. Dr. John B. Smith gives the name of "digger bee" to a blue green bee having a metallic sheen, which may be seen fitting about sandy places during the first heats of May. With the aid of liquid plaster of paris poured into the holes that it makes in the ground he has followed the bee through a wonderful course of digging. The work is done by females, and its primary object is to provide protected cells in which the young are bred. The bee makes a tunnel a quarter of an inch in diameter, which after starting for a few inches on a slope runs straight down into the ground. At the depth of a foot or more short lateral tunnels are driven, and at the ends of these are formed the breeding cells. Having provided for her young, the bee "continues to dig down and yet farther down until she is four feet or even more beneath the surface, dying from sheer exhaustion about the time her first progeny begin to make their way to the surface."--London Mail.
