PREPARING FOR THE FOURTH.

A vote cast by the school children of Wilkes-Barre, Pa., shows that they stand five to one in favor of a safe and sane Fourth of July, without firecrackers, cannon or blank cartridges. The largest vote against fireworks was in the High School, where 460 were for the proposal and only 27 opposed it.

A drastic Fourth of July ordinance is being prepared by City Solicitor Poe, at the request of the fire department of Baltimore. It will permit fireworks to be set off anywhere in the city limits only by a licensed man, and provides the usual penalties for selling or setting off firecrackers or fireworks. The city administration, including the police and fire departments, proposes to enforce the ordinance rigidly.

When a barrel of cap-making material exploded early yesterday at the plant of the Pittsburg Cap and Pistol Company, in Homestead, Pa., black powder so shriveled the body of Foreman Joseph Juno, aged 42 years, that when he was found his identity could not be ascertained for a time. A boy also working in the plant was badly injured, and the factory was wrecked. Widows for two blocks around were shattered. The plant has been working day and night to fill Fourth of July orders for toy pistols and caps for cities where the Fourth of July is celebrated in the usual reckless and dangerous manner.

EXPULSION OF JEWS.

The expulsion of Jews residing il legally in Kiev, Russia, was resumed to day.

The Kiev commission has considered those far about 1,000 cases, of which 850 have been found subject to expul sion. The governor-general has re viewed the decisions of the commission, and confirmed the expulsion of 700 of those ill-fated.

The Jews remaining in Kiev will be allowed to occupy summer villas outside the city only by special permission granted in individual cases.

The police have given 40 Jewish families, declared to be residing illegally in Tashkent, three days in which to leave the town.

The order of expulsion will apply to all of the central provinces of Russia. The government recently took alarm at the growth in commercial settle ments, and decided upon the strict enforcement of the original segregation law, which restricts the territory hab itable by Jews to the Polish provinces and the Ukraine or Little Russia.

The number of Jews within this pale is estimated at 5,000,000. The number within the pale is said to be less than 100,000. Of these at least 25,000 will be compelled to abandon the residence maintained in the pro hibited section. The others will be permitted to remain.

CHARGED WITH SMUGGLING.

Frank W. Rollins, formerly governor of New Hampshire, and now one of the most prominent bankers in Boston, and his son Douglas were arrested in New York yesterday after their arrival from Europe on the Lusitania.

They are charged with conspiring to defraud the government by an attempt to smuggle jewelry and dutiable articles of clothing through the customs. Mr. Rollins is also accused in the complaint, but the accusation affected her so arduously that she was not arrested. She was taken to the Hotel Belmont and will answer the charges against her when she recovers.

The arrests were made after each member of the family had been compelled to submit to a personal search in their state-rooms. Nine trunks brought over by the defendants were seized and taken to the appraisers' stores for examination. There jewelry and dutiable clothing that had not been declared are said to have been found.

Mr. Rollins and his son were arraigned before United States Commissioner Shields late in the afternoon and were released in bail of \$2,000 each, which was furnished by a surety company.

Customs officials asserted that the charges against Mr. Rollins and his family are particularly serious, as the defendants were given an opportunity before arrest to amend their declaration, when it was discovered that they had failed to enter articles found in the first trunk examined.

AUTO JUMPS FROM TRAIN.

Emil Krause, an automobilist, out riding with a friend, found himself trapped in trying to cross the tracks of the Staten Island, N. Y., Railroad in his machine yesterday, as a swiftly moving train loomed suddenly around a sharp curve. Krause, seeing he could not get across, tried to turn the machine about, but only succeeded in swerving it onto the track of the oncoming train. The automobile bumped along the ties for an instant, but Krause, looking over his shoulder, saw that the locomotive was gaining, and turned off the rails just as the train shot up. The automobile plunged down a 35-foot embankment, crashing into a high fence at the bottom. Krause was uninjured, although thrown some distance, but August Clarus, a policeman, riding with him, had three ribs broken and sustained possible internal injuries.

GIANT METEOR IN TEXAS.

A meteor passing through the sky, as though out of the Gulf of Mexico, was seen by thousands in southeastern Texas Thursday night. It appeared like a ball, nearly as large as the moon, and its pas sage through the heavens, leaving a trail of light, consumed about a quarter of a mile. Three distinct explosions marked its flight, and with each a shower of sparks was emitted as from a rocket. It brilliantly illuminated the country for hundreds of miles.

Reports received from many counties throughout south Texas tell of the negroes quitting work and gathering in churches to pray. In Brazoria county a negro camp meeting, attended by about 500, was adjourning when the meteor appeared. The congregation quickly reassembled and spent the entire night singing and praying. The negroes are still in session.

A HUSBAND'S FIENDISH ACT.

Following the testimony of his mother-in-law and several neighbors at a coroner's inquest in Santa Ana, Cal., yesterday Frank Skelly, a contractor, was arrested pending an investigation of the death of his wife, who was supposed to have succumbed to burns received Friday in the explosion of a gasoline stove. According to the testimony of the mother-in-law, Mrs. T. J. Lewis, Skelly threw a quart of gasoline over his wife and then applied a match. Mrs. Lewis said her testimony was based on a statement her daughter had made as she lay dying in a hospital. Neighbors declared they saw Mrs. Skelly rush out into the yard of her home with her clothing ablaze and crying. "Why did you do it, Frank? You have murdered me. Why didn't you use a pistol instead of gasoline?"

Another terrific earthquake has shaken Costa Rica. Scores of dwellings crumbled in San Jose yesterday. It was marked by a low tidal wave. Word comes from San Jose that the greatest shock was probably in the district swept last week. Terror has seized natives and whites there, driving many insane. Exports indit to great damage in Guatemala.
