## FLEW ACROSS ENGLISH CHANNEL

Hon. Charles Stewart Rolls, captain in the London section of the Army Motor Reserve, driving a Wright bi-plane, vindicated Anglo-Saxon aeronautics by crossing the English channel twice yesterday evening without alighting. He made the round trip between Dover and Calais in 90 minutes.

While two Frenchmen, Louis Bleriot and Count De Lesseps, have crossed the channel in an aeroplane, it remained for an Englishman in an American machine to perform the double feat. The distance across between the two points named is 21 miles, so that his over-water flight of 42 miles without a stop established a new record.

Captain Rolls left Dover at 6:30 o'clock. The atmospheric conditions were excellent. He lost no time in maneuvers, but after describing a circle headed towards the coast of France. In anticipation of the flight across the straits, but the pace of the aeroplane was swifter.

Captain Rolls sent his machine to a height of 800 feet, and at that altitude he skimmed through the air like a great bird. The motor worked perfectly. The crowd that watched the start confidently awaited the return, and it was not long before the speck, which those who had telescopes saw disappear on the French coast, reappeared, growing larger with every minute.

When finally the aviator became visible to the naked eye cheer after cheer arose from the enthusiastic spectators, and as he gradually soared toward the landing place made famous by Bleriot he was given an ovation. He alighted at 8 o'clock at almost the same spot as Bleriot, showing little signs of the strain of his magnificent flight.

## NURSE ATTEMPTS SUICIDE.

Desperate over a rebuke and scolding from the man she loved, Mrs. Elinore Wold, a trained nurse, swallowed 16 grains of morphine while seated on a bench in Capitol Park in Richmond early yesterday morning. The woman was found unconscious shortly afterwards and taken to her room by the police, where she was saved through heroic efforts of the physicians. She will live.

This was her second attempt within a few hours to end her life. On Wednesday afternoon, while she talked to the man she loves and who, she says, is a business man in Richmond, she grabbed up a revolver which lay on his desk, and was only restrained from shooting herself by her companion.

Mrs. Wold's father, owner of many ships and barges, often took his daughter with him on long trips and she has circled the globe five times. It was while with him at Havana harbor in 1896 that she met Lieutenant Wold, a dashing young naval officer on the ill-fated Maine. She was married to him June 2, 14 years ago yesterday, and was aboard her father's vessel when she saw the Maine destroyed and her husband lost.

Mrs. Wold entered St. Vincent's Hospital, at New York learned her profession and then located in Richmond where she became acquainted with her present ideal. According to her statement he has treated her cruelly and caused her rash act.

## A DR. JEKYLL AND MR. HYDE

Admitting having committed at least 20 burglaries in Memphis during the last two months, known at the fashionable house where he had quarters as a physician, and attributing his absence at night to the exactions of his profession, J. C. Brown, formerly of Des Moines, Ia., was imprisoned Wednesday night. The police at once began retrieving the numerous bits of jewelry taken by Brown during his nightly travels. So far 10 watches and numerous other trinkets have been recovered.

Brown posed as Dr. E. E. Fuller and but for his lingering too long in the neighborhood of a house he visited several nights ago would still be at liberty. He was recognized by an occupant, and his arrest followed. According to his own declaration, he has served terms of imprisonment in the west.

## EX-GOV. FOLK'S PLATFORM

Missouri democrats of all factions at a dinner at St. Louis last night heard former Governor Joseph W. Folk announce the principles on which, it is said, he will seek the presidential nomination in 1912. The dinner was in charge of men who have been promoting the boom of the former governor. The doctrine of equal rights should be made a living, vital controlling force

in the government," said Mr. Folk, after he had listened to democrats from all parts of the state tell the guests that for the presidency. "The democratic party," continued Mr. Folk, "should insist upon the stamping out of graft and corruption from every department of government; the eradication of all special favors, including bounties, subsidies, and a tariff for any purpose other than revenue.

"We need the honest, sincere enforcement of the laws we already have and the regulation of the rates of public utility corporations upon a reasonable basis, that justice may be done the people and a fair return for the amount actually invested be afforded."

Other principles named by Mr. Folk were the preservation of the rights of the states to self-government; the restriction of American territory to the western hemisphere as a necessary corollary of the Monroe doctrine; the extension of American trade by revising the restriction upon commerce; a just income tax; the election of United States senators by direct vote, and unrelenting opposition to the domination in public affairs of special interests, and the elimination of such influences from politics.


