LAST OF THE CLIPPERS.

That the last of the world-famous Baltimore clippers has gone to the bottom of the sea is the meaning of the terse wireless message from Diamond Shoal Lightship Tuesday that the barkentine Good News, Capt. Peter Eriksson, had foundered off the southern coast. Captain Eriksson, of Baltimore; his daughter, Miss Elizabeth Eriksson, and the crew of 10 men were picked up by the British steamer Metis and landed at Norfolk Tuesday. The Good News, the last survivor of the romantic days when the white-winged clippers of the Chesapeake were the first in with tea from China, coffee from Brazil or rounded the Horn with the 49s, had sailed from Philadelphia May 8 and foundered June 3, having sprung a leak in a heavy gale, that left the graceful beauty a water-logged hulk. The seas broke over her for days and the captain, his daughter and his 10 men were forced to take to the open boats in a turbulent sea. They were tossed about day and night until the British steamer Metis came in sight and rescue all hands.
Thus was wiped out the late model of the ships that sailed 5,000 miles to Brazil in 30-day days, rounded Cape Horn to the Golden Gate in a little more than a hundred days, crossed the Atlantic in something like 18 days, and beat all the English ships east from the Orient.

FREDERICKSBURG SUMMER INSTITUTE.

All initial preparations have been made for opening the State Summer Institute at Fredericksburg, June 30th. Indications point to increased attendance. The facilities for conducting this popular summer school are much better than they have hitherto been. The management has found it necessary to enlarge the faculty, as announced in the handsome catalogue of the school recently issued. Mr. Malcolm H. Arnold, M.A., Ph.D., has been added to the faculty and will have charge of the English work in the professional course. Miss Adele Ogilvie, director of music in the Richmond public schools, has been secured to teach vocal music. Mr. C. C. Pease, M.A., will have charge of part of the work in history. The other members of the faculty, 16 in all, have been announced through the catalogue.
The opening exercises of the institute will take place in the Assembly Hall of the public school building on the evening of June 29th. The following interesting programme will be rendered: Music, direction of Miss Ogilvie; address of welcome, Mayor Wallace; response, W. L. Prince; music; literary address, Prof. Robert Lee Blanton.

APPALLING ACCIDENT.

Three mourners, their pastor and their driver sat in a funeral coach near Haverstraw, N. Y., yesterday afternoon and watched certain death come rushing on them at 50 miles an hour.
With a screech of grinding breaks, a heavy West Shore freight engine, hurrying south to pick up a train at Weehawken, crashed into the coach, scattering its occupants along the right of way, and came slowly to a halt 150 yards beyond the crossing. All the occupants were either killed outright or fatally injured. The dead are: Rev. A. Romath, pastor of the New City Methodist Episcopal Church; E. V. Seifred, New City, N. Y.; Mrs. E. V. Seifred, New City, N. Y.; William Beebe, Haverstraw; Mrs. Perry Kessler had her skull fractured, both legs broken and body crushed.

The accident was not only unusual, but dramatic and horrifying to a degree. It happened at the foot of Graveyard Hill, in full sight of the returning funeral procession, of which the wrecked coach was the first, and of the terrified and helpless watchman.
The watchman was lurching in his little cabin when the tinkle of an electric bell warned him of an approaching train. Mechanically he pulled the lever that set the heavy, balanced gate in motion. Then, glancing from the open door, he saw a sight that will not be out of his dreams for many a night.
Just what happened will probably never be known, but some eye-witnesses say that the arms of the crossing gates, late in descending, blocked the coach after it had crossed the first of two tracks and held it prisoner on the rails, while the terrified occupants sat paralyzed gazing at the onrushing locomotive.
The driver lashed his horses in a futile attempt to force the vehicle from the track until, with a sharp crack it seemed as if the coach literally blew up.
Fragments of splintered wood and mutilated shreds of humanity were flung far and wide. The engine stopped. There was absolute silence, save for the hiss of escaping steam.
A search for the dead followed. The bodies of Mr. and Mrs. Seifred were found side by side 50 yards down the track. The wife was just return-

ing from the burial of her father, by whose death she had come into a tidy fortune.

Young Beebe, the driver, was the son of a wealthy livery owner. He lay 20 yards nearer, stone dead.
Rev. Mr. Romath was the clergyman who had officiated at the funeral.
