## LAWYER IS INDICTED.

Charles M. Erbstein, one of the attorneys for Lee O'Neill Browne, who was recently acquitted of a charge of bribing State Representative Charles A. White to vote for William Lorimer for United States senator, was indicted in Chicago charged with corrupting a member of the jury which cleared Browne.  
The juror in question, Grant McCutchen, and Henry T. Stacy, alleged go-betweens, according to their stories told to State's Attorney Wayman, received \$250, which they divided equally for McCutchen's vote on the verdict.  
Stacy had, he said, expected to receive a large sum of money for his work as well as a political job. He was working on a small salary, he said, and rumors that there was plenty of money available in Browne's behalf was a temptation that he could not resist when he found opportunity in the form of his friend McCutchen on the jury knocking at his door.  
According to his story Stacy sought out State Representative Erickson and asked how he could market McCutchen's vote. Erickson, Stacy said, replied that he was not personally interested in the case, but would put him in touch with someone who was.  
Soon afterward, Stacy asserted, he was introduced to Mr. Erbstein. Meanwhile Stacy had communicated with McCutchen. The jury was closely guarded, but Stacy said he managed to arrange a code of signals by which the juror would know whether the financial arrangements with Erbstein had been consummated. The "high sign" was one of these signals, and another was the word "stick."  
McCutchen received the signals and according to his own story, became a partisan of Browne's at once. He voted for acquittal on the first ballot, and argued to bring others to his side.  
When the time came to realize on McCutchen's alleged perjury, he and Stacy went to Erbstein's office, so they declare. They thought there would be at least \$2,000 in cash and also easy jobs. According to Stacy, they could scarcely believe their eyes when the lawyer gave them only \$100. Later, they said, he gave them \$150 more.  
Stacy testified before the grand jury that he made nearly 90 visits to the lawyer's office looking for money and jobs.

## FARMER MURDERED.

The Black Hand, it is believed, has added another victim to its long list of murders. Late Monday night Andy Tearsack, a farmer, living near Wheeling, W. Va., was slain in the yard in front of his house. He was standing at the fence talking to a neighbor, when a stranger advanced through the darkness and inquired for his name.  
"Andy Tearsack," replied the unsuspecting man.  
"You die then," said the stranger, and he plunged a long knife half a dozen times into the breast of Tearsack.  
The thing happened so quickly that Tearsack's companion was unable to interfere. Tearsack died instantly and the murderer took to the woods. Posses of officers are following him with blood hounds.  
It is believed that Tearsack was condemned to die by a Black Hand lodge and that his murderer did not even know him.

## ANOTHER CAVE-IN.

The first tragedy attending the falling in of earth at Staunton occurred yesterday when one workman lost his life in the cavern beneath the earth, another was carried down headlong into the waters, but was rescued, while two others had the earth to slip from under them, but caught on to the solid ground and scrambled out.  
The men were engaged in building a reinforced cement arch, about 15 feet below the street level, on Lewis street, over the seam in the limestone rock which leads to the cavern below. Nearly the whole distance across the street had been arched, and they were working near the curb, opposite the residence of Jacob Yeat.

## King Street Real Estate for Sale

The earth under the curb, sidewalk, and a wall marking Mr. Yost's line had not been disturbed, and it was planned to brace it until the cement work was completed.  
Suddenly portions of this earth slid toward the open chasm and swept the men along with it. S. M. Sprouse, 59 years old, and Dennet Fortune, both white, disappeared into the water, about 80 feet deep. Sprouse's body has not been found, but Fortune rose to the surface, having been carried some distance under the arch. He swam to the side, held on to the rough rocks, and was rescued, a rope being thrown to him.  
Two colored men, Warren Taylor and George Obie, saved themselves by jumping as they felt the earth slipping.  
Within an hour after the tragedy the pavement and the stone wall had slid off and gone into the opening for a distance of about 20 feet, possibly burying Sprouse beneath.  
The accident does not enlarge the area of the original chasm, except as to the surface, which is widened.
