TWO NEGROES LYNCHED. Two negroes, instead of one as first reported, were hanged from a telegraph pole Monday night in Flint river swamps, less than a mile from the centre of Montezuma, Ga.

Both William Barnes and John Walker were held for the murder of Night Policeman Bush, of Montezuma. Walker was taken from the jail at Oglethorpe by a mob. Barnes was arrested Monday and after being taken to Oglethorpe, was brought back to the workhouse at Montezuma. He is said to have made a full confession.

At 9 o'clock Monday night citizens heard a number of pistol shots and found the body of Barnes hanging from a telegraph pole, riddled with bullets. At midnight more pistol shots were heard and yesterday morning the body of Walker was seen hanging from the same pole.

ROOSEVELT AND HIS CANDIDATE. "Absolutely nothing to say," was the word that came from Sagamore Hill Tuesday night. Theodore Roosevelt was at home all evening, but he declined even to receive interviewers. Kermit Roosevelt appeared at the door when, at 9:30 o'clock, an attempt was made to see the former president.

The colonel has absolutely nothing to say," said Kermit. Only fragmentary returns were received at Sagamore Hill during the evening, and up to 10 o'clock the colonel had heard almost nothing of the way the elections were going outside New York State. When Kermit was informed of the returns from Ohio, Massachusetts, New Jersey, and Connecticut, he turned abruptly and hastened into the house to tell the news to his father.

Roosevelt has given no indication as to what political moves he will make in the future. In the old family carry-all Theodore Roosevelt drove from Sagamore Hill on Tuesday to the polling place in the fire company's house in Oyster Bay and cast his vote. Kermit Roosevelt voted at the same time. Kermit, never having cast a vote before, did not know how to do it, and his father showed him how.

"No matter what the result of the election is," says the ex-president, the republican party will carry on the fight on the same lines."

Henry L. Stimson attributes his defeat to causes nation-wide and a general movement of the republican party toward progressivism. "There seems to be a ground swell all over the country," he said that night, "and I was caught in it. I think it's only the beginning. We're beginning to have a realignment of political parties, and the republican party is going through the agony of becoming progressive. The returns speak for themselves. I have nothing to regret. We've had a good clean fight. I was surprised that I ran so well up with the rest of the ticket."

Inquiries were made yesterday for the reservation of balconies and windows for "that glad some day when Champ Clark, speaker-elect," drives a span of Missouri mules through Pennsylvania avenue from the Capitol to the White House.


