EGGS VERY CHEAP.

Market plentifully supplied at 23 Cents Per Dozen.

The mild weather of the past week has been productive of a very large egg crop, which is good news at this season, and for Easter Sunday it is certain that no one need be without fresh eggs. The market is well supplied with fresh country eggs, which are bringing from 22 to 23 cents a dozen. Of vegetables the most exacting housewife will find a good variety with the quality up to the best Easter standard. Asparagus is still 20 cents a bunch for large bunches, and spring onions and lettuce, fresh from the Southern truck farms and some home grown, are displayed. They sell at three bunches for 5 cents and 5c and 10c a head respectively. Large Indian River Florida oranges are now on the market. They are from 40 to 45 a dozen. Splendid cauliflower, small heads, are 10 cents, while the largest bring as much as 20 cents. Fresh Southern grown tomatoes are now selling for 10 cents a pound for fine large specimens.

In the meat line it is announced that the dealers will have on sale tomorrow the first of the new spring lamb for this season. Hinquartets are quoted at 35 cents, and forequarters 25 cents per pound. Other meats are in about the same state of prices as last week, there being no change in the prices except in hams, smoked hams having gone up two cents a pound.

Chickens are not in great demand this week, and prices consequently are very reasonable. Butter is holding up in price, selling from 35c to 45 cents for the trade marked brands.

FIGHT IN ZION.

Workmen, Angered by Nine Months of Prayer, Charge Meeting.

Chicago, March 21.—An elder of the Zion Church was probably fatally injured, three others suffered badly battered faces and scores of followers of Wilbur Glenn Voliva sustained broken heads yesterday when rioting broke out afresh in Zion City between the anti-tobacco crusaders and employes of the Cook electrical plant.

Angered by nine months of continuous prayer and singing outside of their plant, the workmen charged the camp of the crusaders across the road and broke up the meeting. Elder W. S. Peckham is in a serious condition. He was hit over the head and rolled down an embankment.

Other crusaders were badly bruised.

Crossed Ocean in Motor Boat.

Captain Thomas Fleming Day, of New York, editor of the Rudder, a periodical devoted to the interest of boating, and other aquatic sports, was a guest of honor at a dinner given by Washington yachtsmen at the New Raleigh last night. Among the clubs represented was the Alexandria Boat Club.

John P. Welcker acted as toastmaster, and after the cloth had been removed Captain Day gave an illustrated talk on his experience on the yawl Sea Bird and later the 35-foot power boat Detroit in crossing the Atlantic.

Car Jumps Switch.

Binghamton, N. Y., March 21.—A charge of a strike-breaker, a crowded trolley car jumped a switch yesterday, rolled across the pavement and side-walk, broke through an iron fence and overturned against a terrace, fatally injuring one man and painfully injuring a score of other passengers.

The man who will die of skull fracture, the physicians say, is Charles Heinke, a city fireman. Wallace O'Neil also suffered a fractured skull but will recover and his brother Harry, was seriously cut. Mrs. James Foley was another seriously injured. The others suffered painful but minor cuts and bruises.

The city authorities have been asked several times during the street car strike to investigate the handling of cars by incompetent strike-breakers. A number of less serious accidents have occurred but the Public Service Commission and the local officials have refused to take up the matter. Today's accident forced the police to make an investigation.
