NEWS OF THE DAY.

I. H. Michael, dismissed chief page of the House of Representatives last night presented to the House lobby investigating committee charges against Rep. E. J. McDermott, of Illinois, for years his sponsor. McMichael corroborated the allegations of M. M. Mulhall against McDermott, and made additional charges. McMichael alleged that the Chicago representative told him that he received \$7,500 out of a fund of \$10,000 raised by Washington pawnbrokers to oppose a bill passed in the last Congress regulating interest rates in the District of Columbia.

Mystery surrounds the death of a young woman about 19 years of age, whose body was found floating in the Allegheny river in the vicinity of Pittsburgh, Pa., yesterday morning. Both eyes were discolored and the lips cut, indicating death by violent means.

Five thousand persons are reported to have been killed in the fighting that is going on in Canton, China, and its environs between the government forces and rebels. Looting continues, and there has been a wholesale destruction of property.

Suit has been entered by Miss Alice M. Hopkins, of Pittsburgh, Pa., against Christopher H. Wisser, a coal operator of Dravosburg, for \$50,000 alleging breach of promise to marry.

Six passengers in an automobile were killed and the driver dangerously injured, when an Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe passenger train struck a machine at a crossing a mile east of Carrollton, Mo. yesterday.

Mexican federalists in the state of Durango are it is alleged, shooting prisoners taken, regardless of nationality.

Rev. Charles H. Holbrooke, an American missionary, who was born at Southwick, Massachusetts, has been shot to death at Souchier, a town of Asia Minor, according to advices received at Constantinople. He was on a tour with American teachers from Sivas, where he was station manager for the American Board of Foreign Missions.

J. J. Cain, of Dallas, Tex., was victim yesterday of a fiendish murder and robbery. He was found in an alley in South Omaha almost disemboweled, with a knife slash 18 inches long across his abdomen. Except to say that the deed was committed by negroes, Cain was unable to give the details of the murder and died at a hospital shortly after being found. Two arrests have been made. Cain was a clerk.

Mrs. Stephen Drakowski and her twin babies which she was wheeling in a go-cart, were fatally injured Thursday when struck by the Monon train at a southside crossing in Chicago.

A mob that overpowered 15 deputies battered its way into the county jail at Morgan, Ga., yesterday and shot dead Robert Lovett, a negro accused of killing two white men.

Wearing a constant smile, Glenn Linn, 28 years old, is awaiting death at the Cook Hospital, Fairmont, W. Va., from bichloride poisoning. Linn was baptized late Wednesday night in a bathtub in the hospital. Linn was Fairmont's leading authority on baseball and sporting matters. He was also the pioneer of the moving picture business in Fairmont. For several years he was sporting writer on the Fairmont Daily Times. Linn had been despondent, and last Monday in the fire station he swallowed more than 20 grains of bichloride of mercury.

Mrs. Katherine D. Guthrie, of Washington, D. C., was found dead yesterday morning in a pool of blood at her summer home at Asbury Park, N. J., with a towel tied tightly around her neck. The police suspect foul play or suicide, but the neighbors say that death was caused by bleeding at the nose, to which the aged woman was acutely subject.

The tugboat Edith Winship, which was sunk near this city during the storm of the 30th of July, started today for Baltimore in tow of one of the Taylor tugboats. The Winship will be repaired at that place.
