Luther Canter was sentenced by Judge Campbell immediately before the adjournment of court today to be executed on Friday, June 11.

He denied that his brother James had anything to do with the crime. In spite of his story the prosecution seems convinced that the younger brother was with Luther at the time of the murder.

The prosecution has developed a strong chain of evidence around James Canter. It was shown that the brothers met near the Canter home, where they are said to have talked over James' trouble with the husband of Mrs. Wilson and other affairs relating to the Wilsons.

SHOCK TO NEW YORKERS

Feeling Against Germany Bitter in the Metropolis

New York, May 8.—Nothing since the actual declaration of war on France by Germany has been such a shock to New Yorkers as was the report yesterday of the torpedoing of the Lusitania.

Everywhere crowds gathered to discuss the latest news, and more anger was shown than at any time since the war began.

A middle-aged man, who gave the name of Henry Schultz, was watching a newspaper's bulletin board yesterday when news of the Lusitania's sinking was posted.

Some one caught his hat and began tearing it up. In a minute the half-hundred spectators were crying "Knock him down" "Kill him" and "Hang him" A small riot followed, in which half a dozen men grabbed the man.

A blow on the jaw felled him and then onlookers began to kick him. Three policemen interfered. They sent him to the hospital, but he was unwilling. Hatless, he limped away.

MRS. CARMAN DENIES ALL

Mineola, N. Y., May 8.—Mrs. Florence Conklin Carman testified in her own defense yesterday at her trial on the charge of murder in connection with the fatal shooting of Mrs. Louise D. Bailey in the office of her husband, Dr. Edwin Carman, in Freeport, June 30 last.

On direct examination Mrs. Carman denied everything to which Celia Coleman, her former negro maid, had testified. She denied that she had ever used a revolver or other firearms, but admitted that there was a pistol in her room at the time of the shooting.

After her cross-examination Mrs. Carman burst into tears. The case is expected to go to the jury this afternoon.
